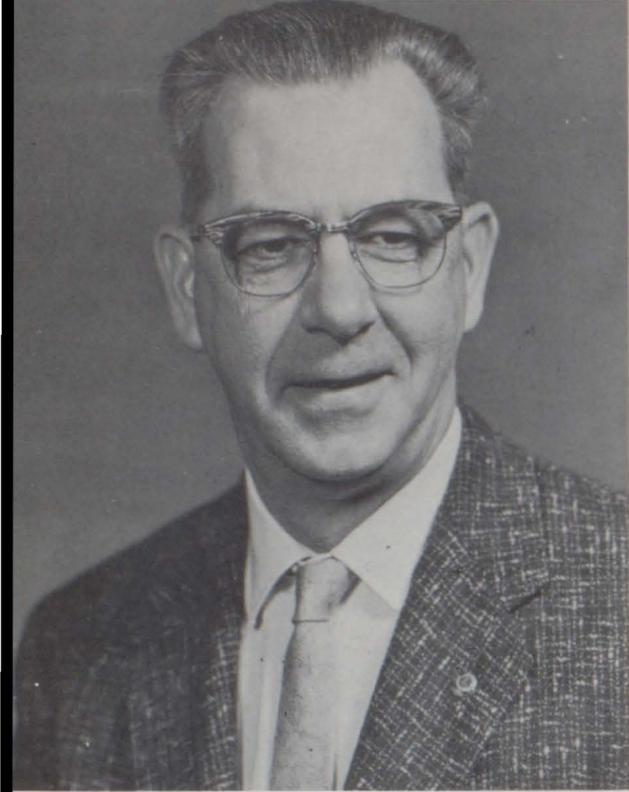
It is a pleasure to have this opportunity to congratulate the students of Lebanon Union High School on your many achievements and enthusiastic spirit during this school year.

The first meeting was held in March with the traditional basketball game between the faculty and seniors. The faculty proved that old age and experience are better than youth by edging the seniors 21-19.

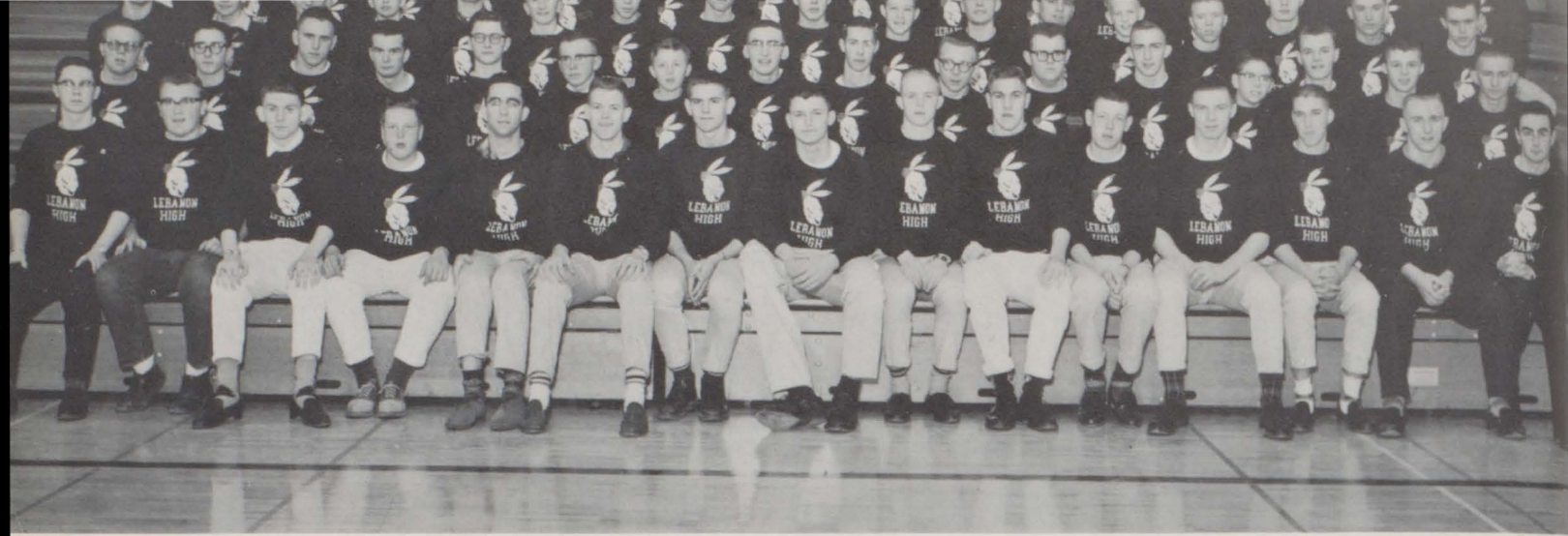
At the second meeting movies were shown in the auditorium on sports briefs and auto racing.

In February and March we painted scenery for the all-school operetta "The Red Mill". This was a new and interesting experience for many members.

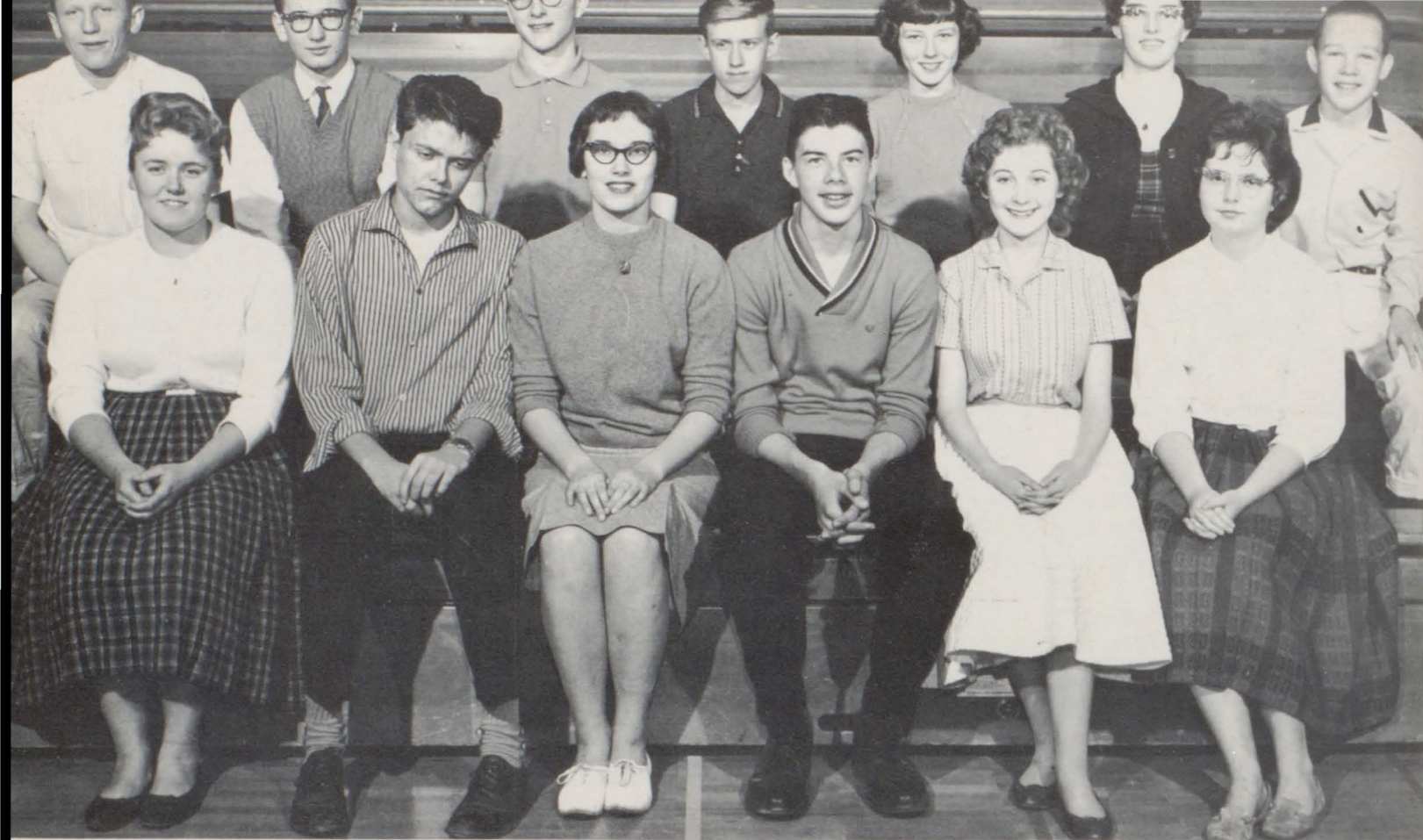

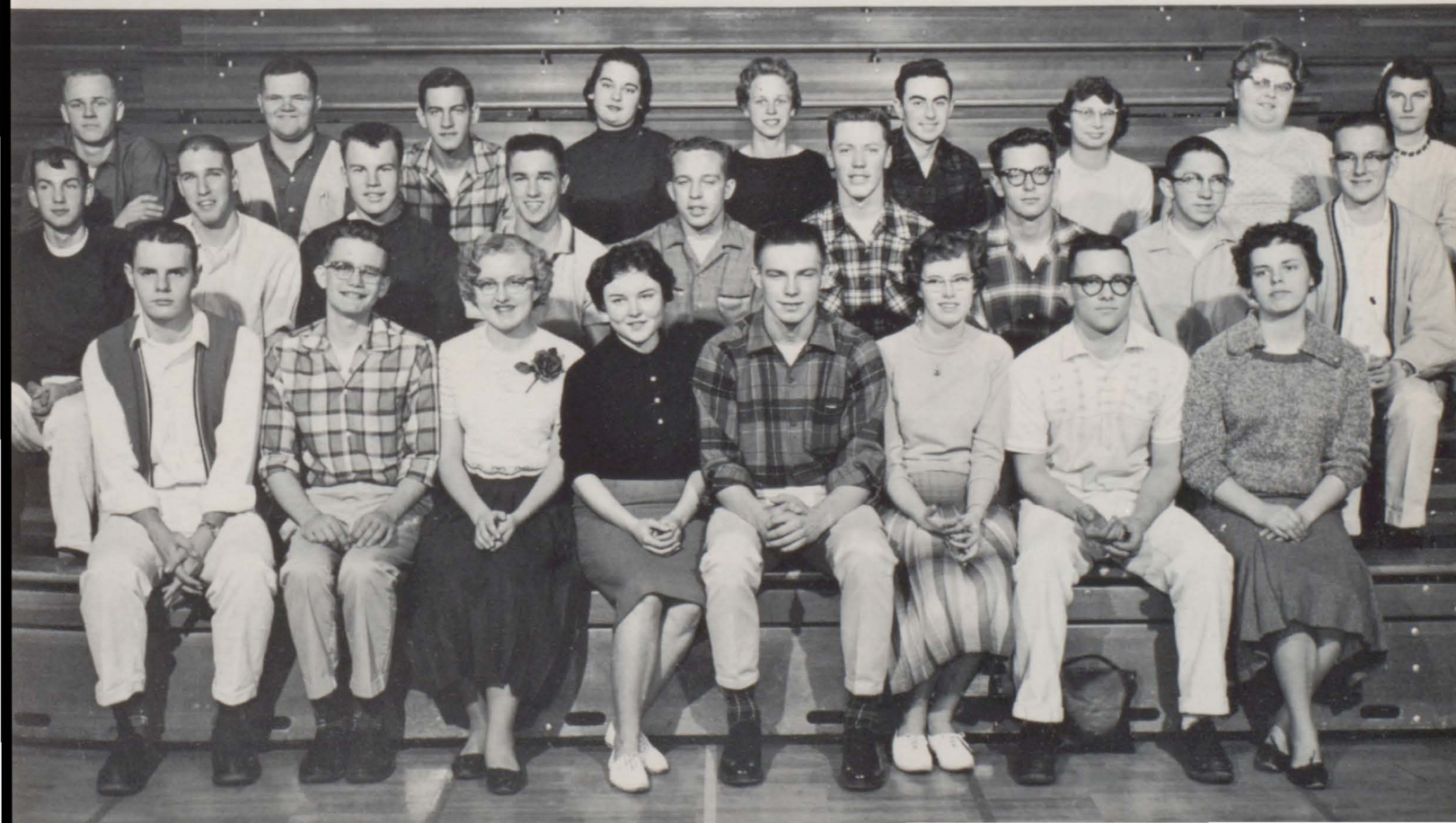
The highlight of the year is our employer-employee banquet at which time the employer of the year is named. Another fine award given is the Chamber of Commerce D. E. Student of the Year Award.

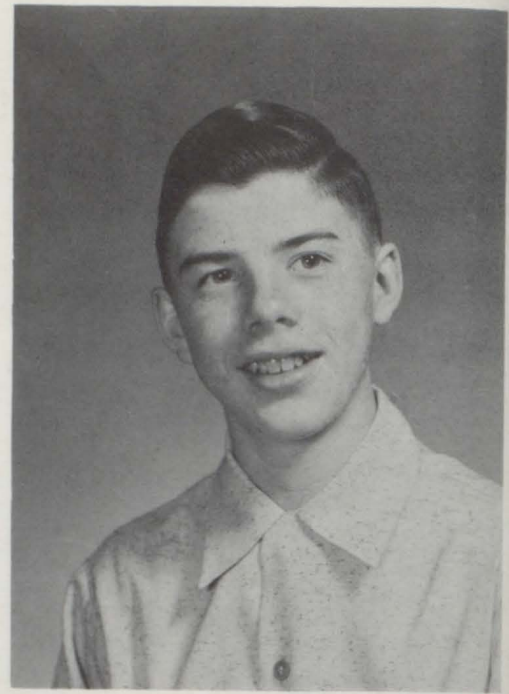


American Field Service Semi-finalists
