
Homecoming

Basketball Homecoming








This years Winter Formal differed from years past, in that Team Electronics took care of the music by playing records, insread of having a live band.

The Lebanon JV football ream shows promise though having lost four games.


The young Warriors started the season with three victories. After some key injuries, the Warriors dropped four straight games to their valley league foes.

Curris Garrett was voted Most valuable. Kelly French, who was a consistent runner throughout the season, looks to have a promising season next year.










Girls Cross Country







Terry Joyner was chosen as 1st team All-League, and also 1st team All State. Mike Evans and Tom Rappe' was chosen as Honorable Mention All League.







The Freshman Baskerball ream finished 1 the season with a total of 6 wins and 14 losses, with a league standing of 6 wins and 12 losses.



The club has five officers. President-Jim LaPointe; Vice President-Chris Henne; Secretary-Kay Perermen; Robot-at-large-David Wombacher.






Counselors also work with students and their parents to solve problems which occur at home, and meet with students and their reachers to solve problems which occur in the classroom.

The Vocational Computer lab in room 21 was established this year to directly support the various activities in the Vocational Area. Computer accounting projects, payroll simulations, inventory control, word processing projects, agriculture simulations, and building hear loss are some of the ways that computers are used by the vocational area to help train students for the world of work.

American Field Service

The AFS was founded in 1914 by former American Field Service Ambulance drivers. American and foreign students were hosted by families in Europe during their service year in World War I and II; after the war, some of them decided to go back to visit those families where they had been hosted or to host their "brothers and sisters" in this country. The program started officially in 1948 with the motto "walk together, talk together." The program now promotes international understanding primarily through exchange of secondary school students age 16 to 18 years old.

The program involves almost all the countries in the world. The program in Lebanon started in 1958 with an Italian student, Gianni Casetta and Ann Morse who went to Germany. Since then, 43 students from all over the world, even Ethiopia, Netherlands, Turkey and Uganda came in Lebanon; and 41 went abroad.



Entering into the library one cannot help but notice the 38 flags hanging on the wall. But probably very few know the story that is behind these flags.

In 1975 our library was enlarged and where it used to be windows, a wall was put. The library staff decided to put something artistic on that wall. Mrs. Williams suggested putting up some flags to represent the countries where the A.F.S. students had gone or had come from. She worked hard for 18 months to find a way to buy these flags. Finally, the American Legion Post 51 and Auxiliary decided to pay for the 25 flags that started the collection in our library.

On January 11, 1976 during a dinner with the theme "Spiriir of '76", the 25 flags honoring American Field Service Exchange students were placed on the wall.


Our collection in the library now numbers 36 flags representing all the countries involved with the Lebanon program and also the United States and United Nations flag.






Graduation






