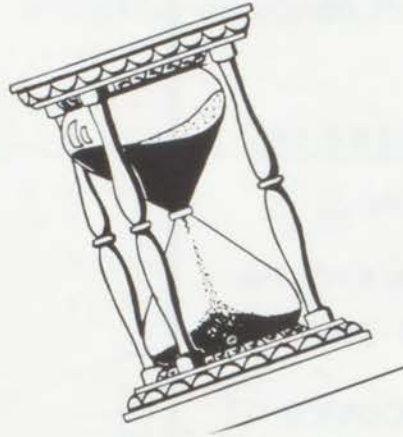

I think we have learned a lot this year. We've had to deal with many setbacks and numerous successes, all of which have put us where we are today.

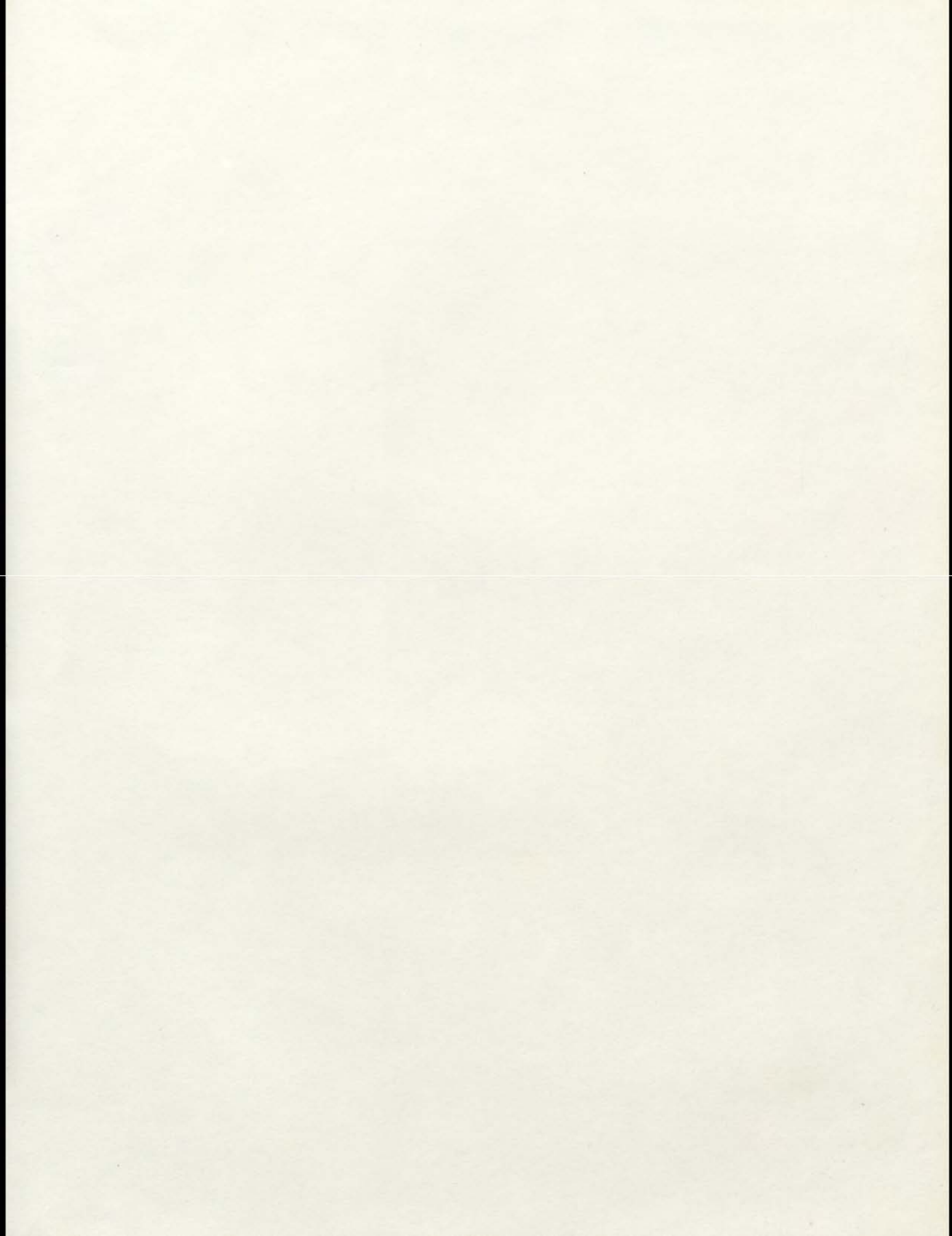
To all the underclassmen, hang in there 'cuz there really is a God. All you have to do is find him!

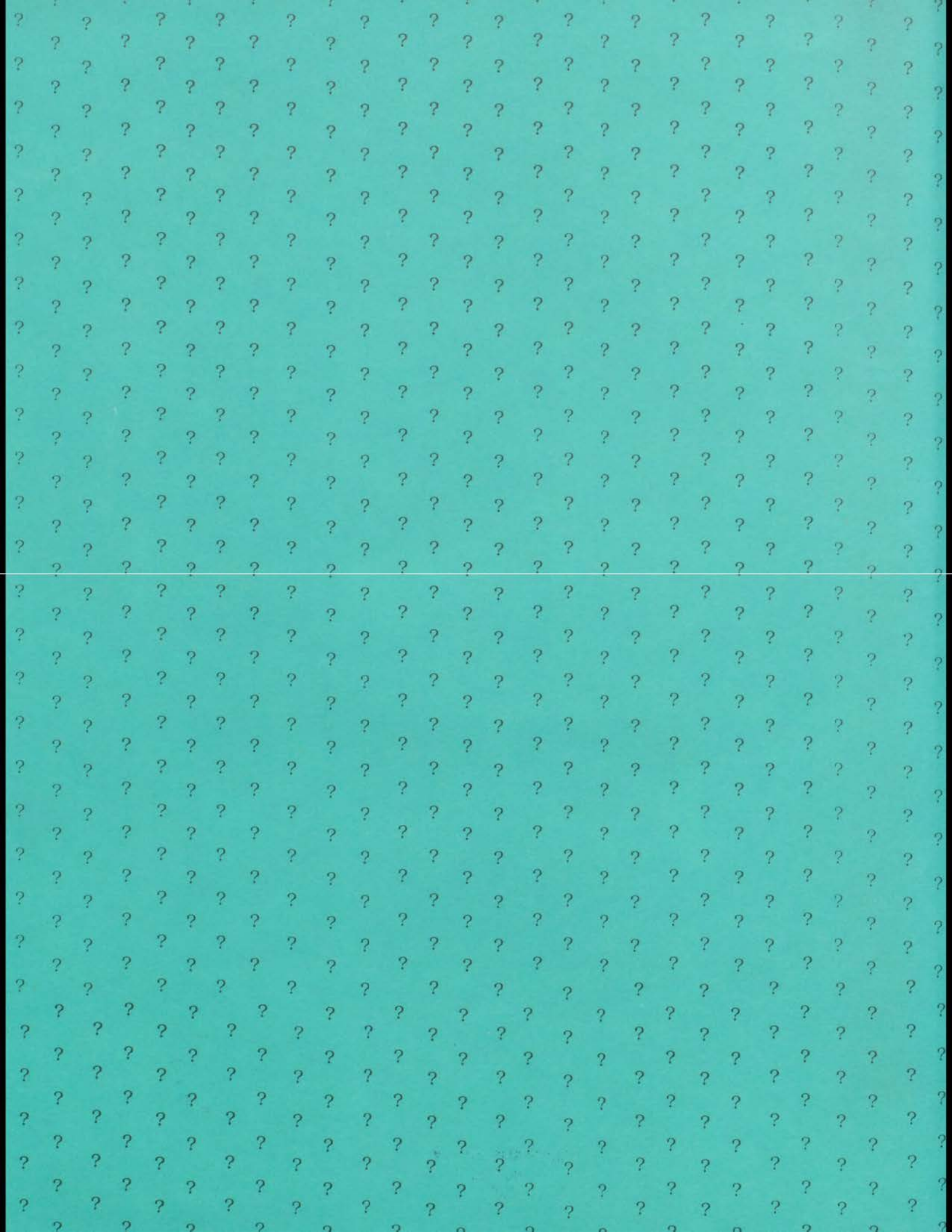

OUR BIG STORY

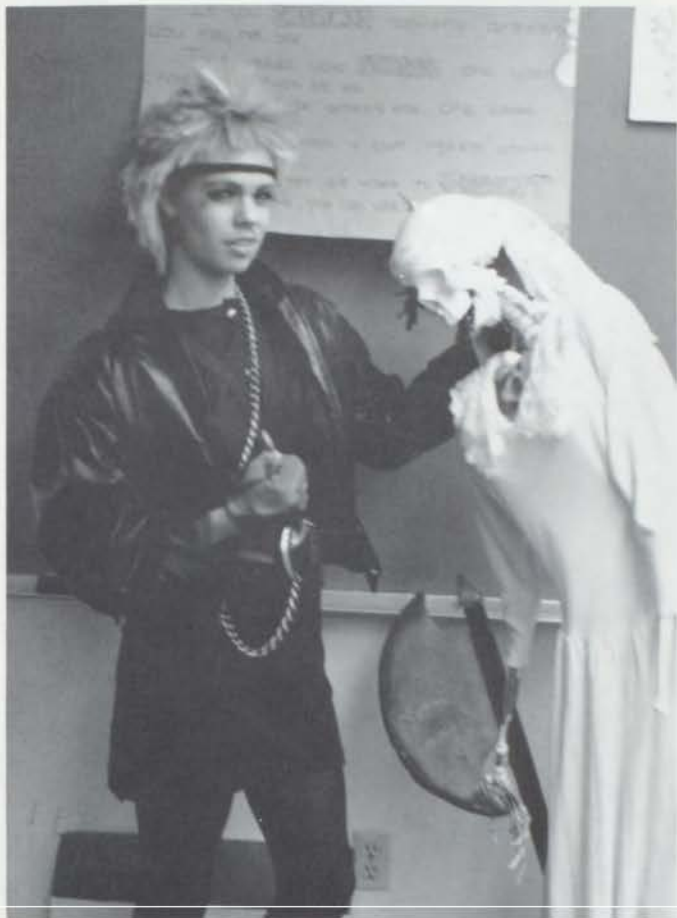

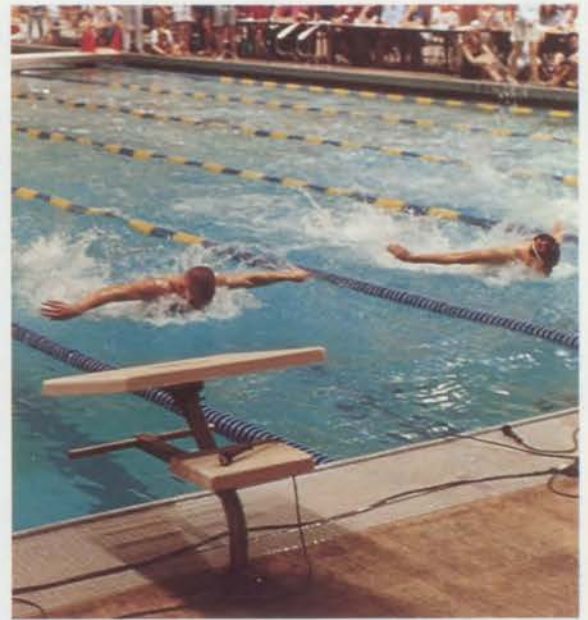

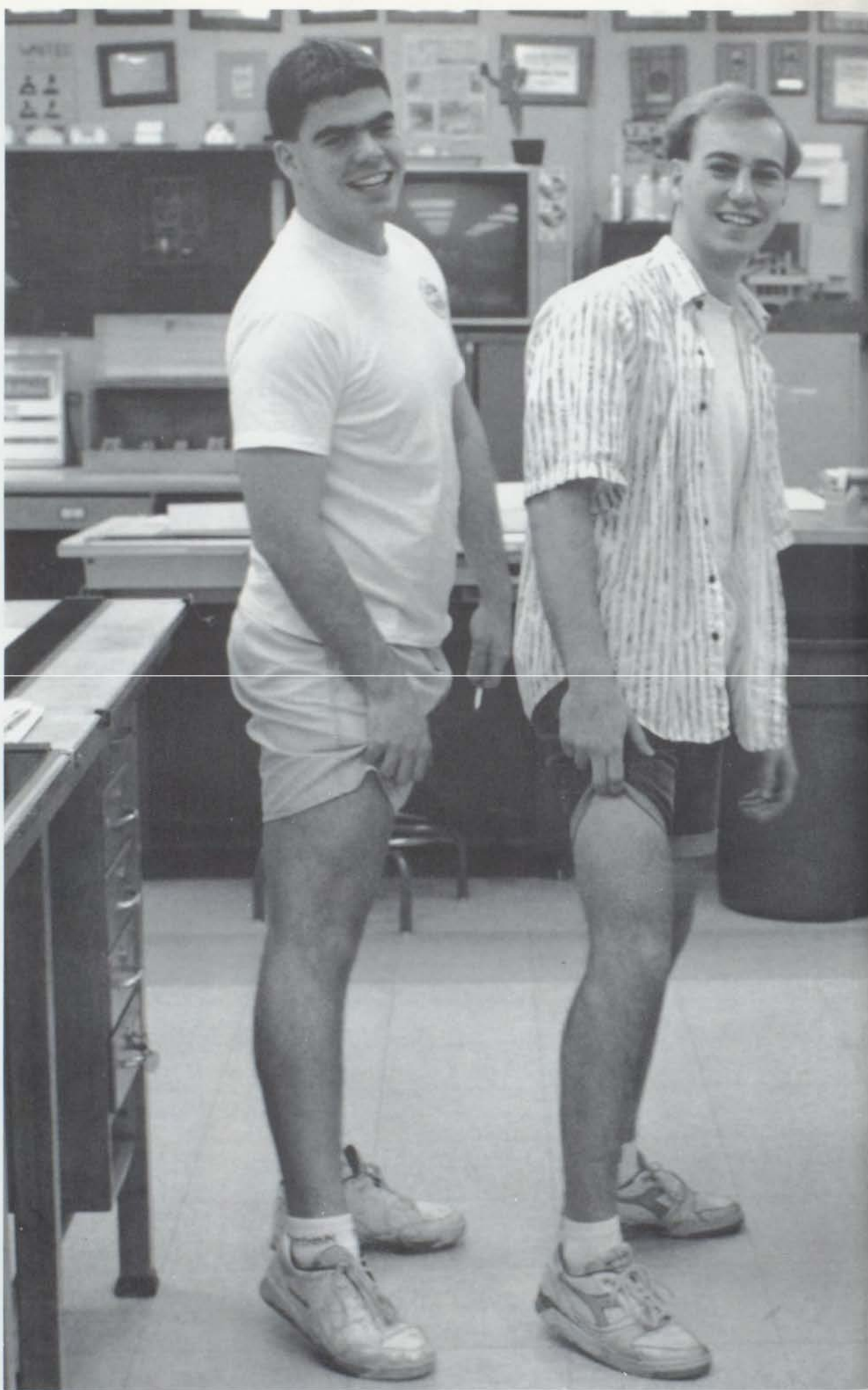

"A Christmas Carol" wasn't the only great success this year as far as plays go...

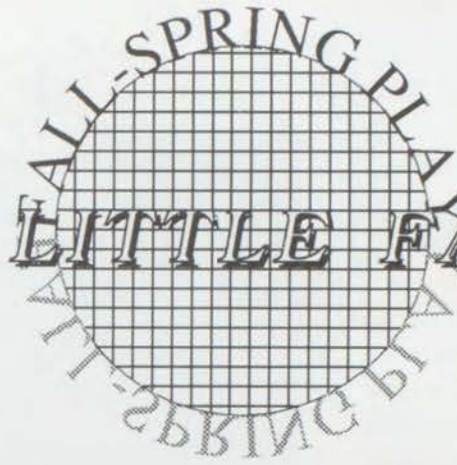

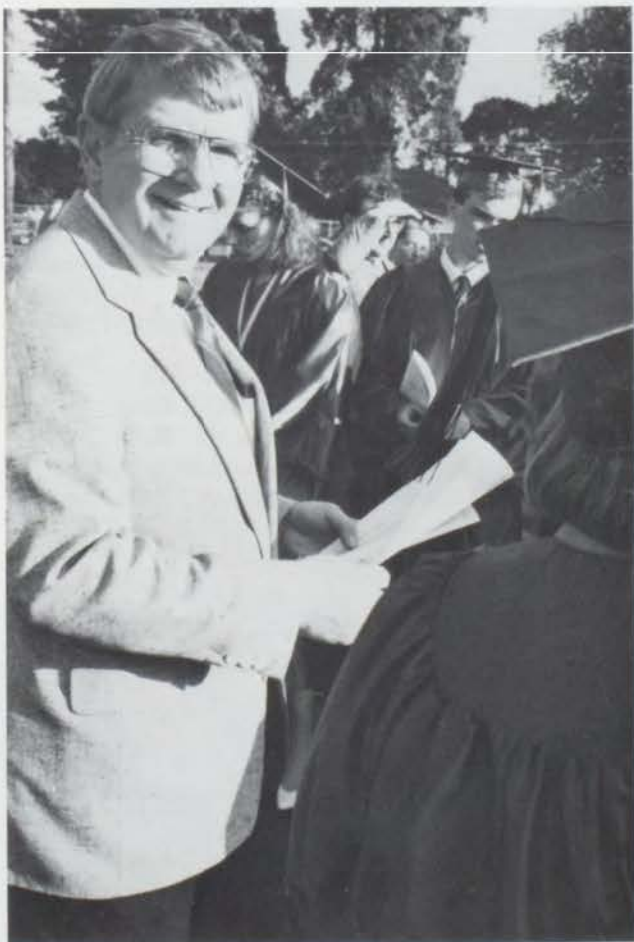

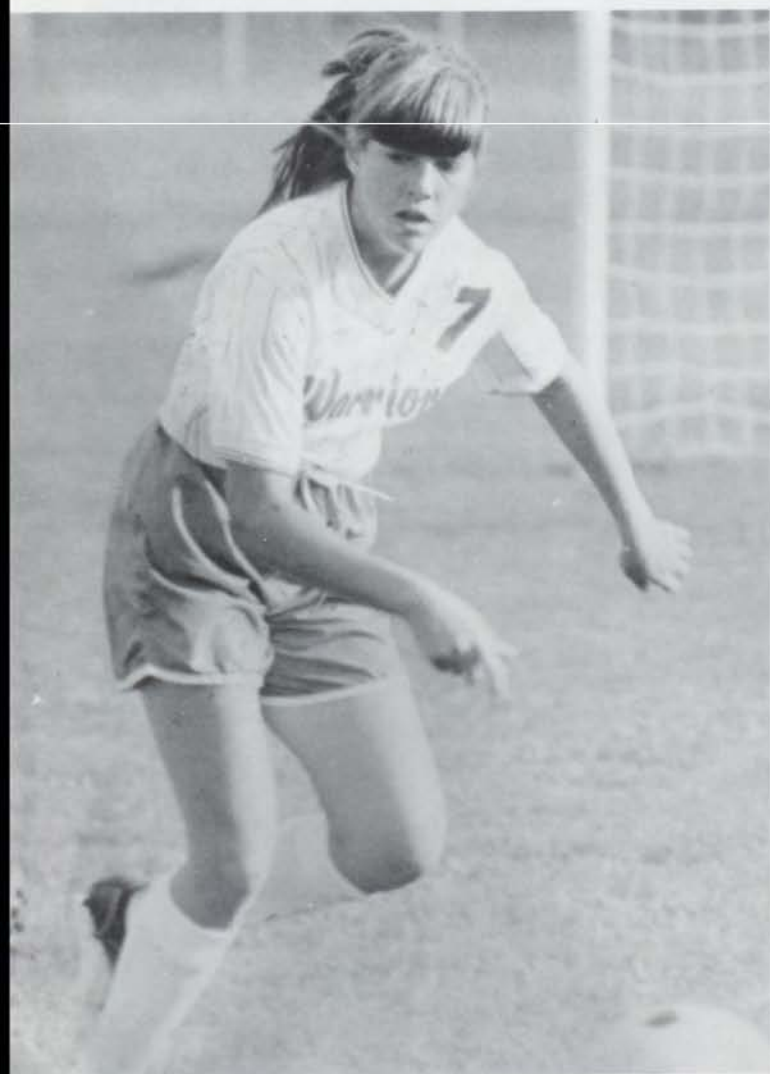

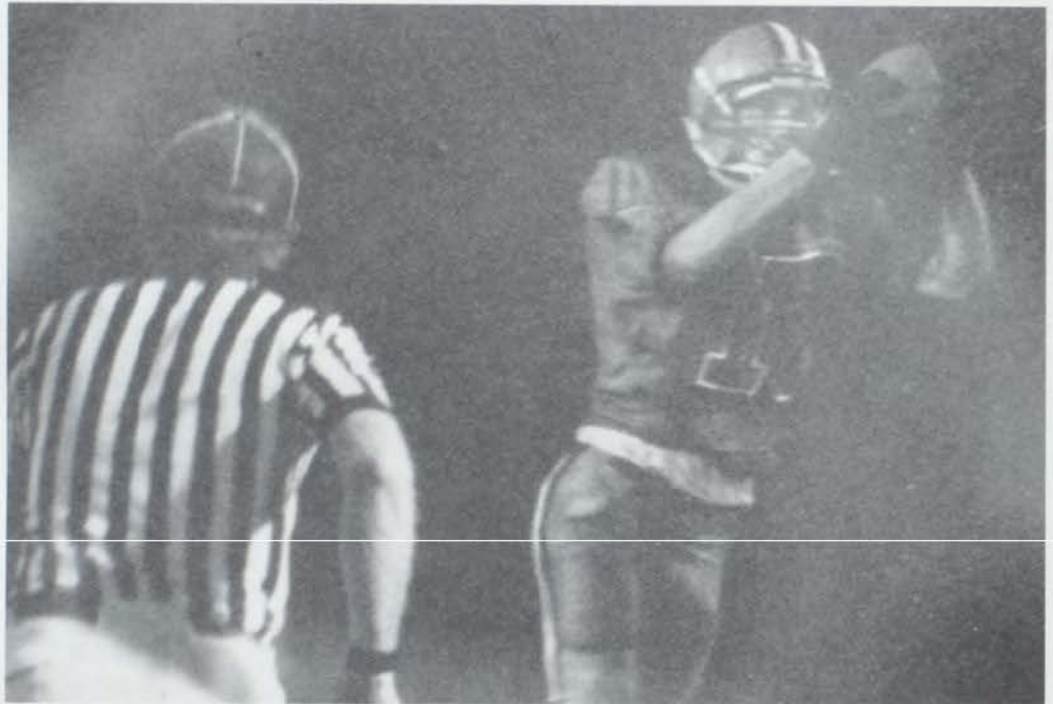
HOPES

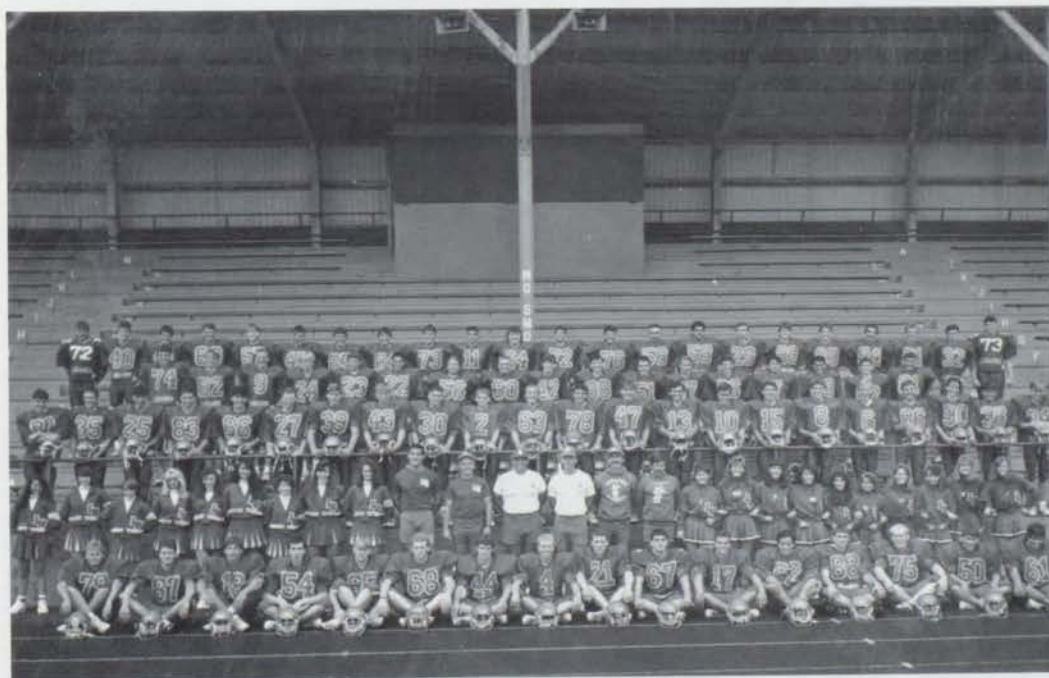

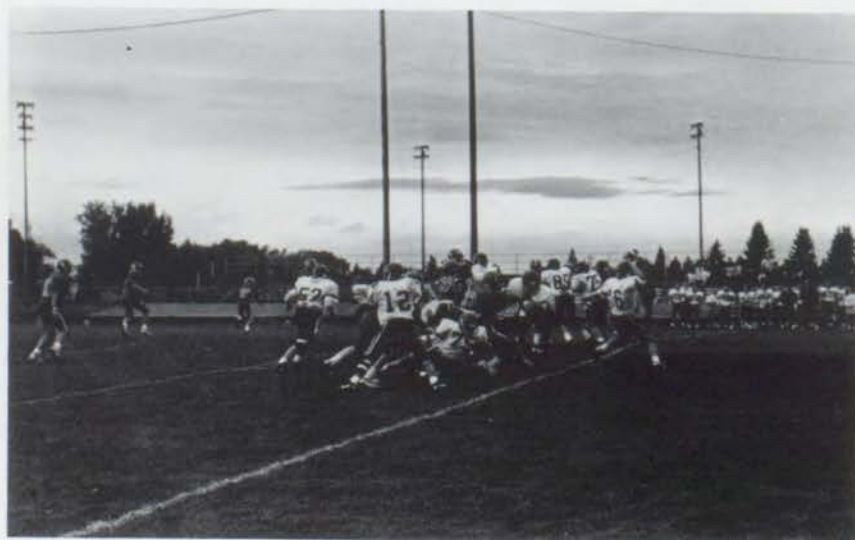

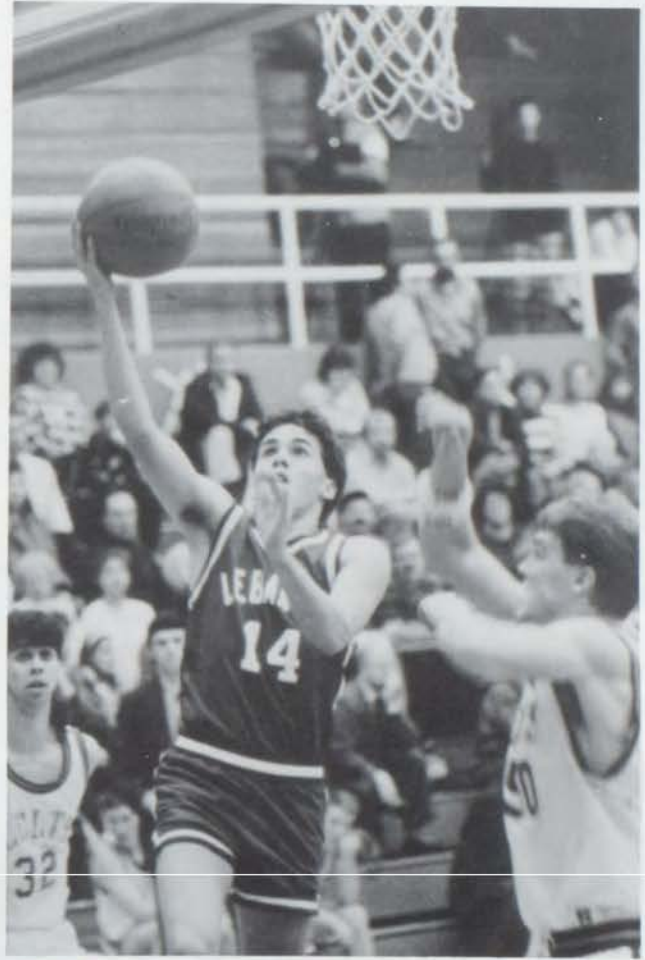

Coach Winters commented, "The Freshman boy's basketball team improved a great deal in the 1990-91 campaign.

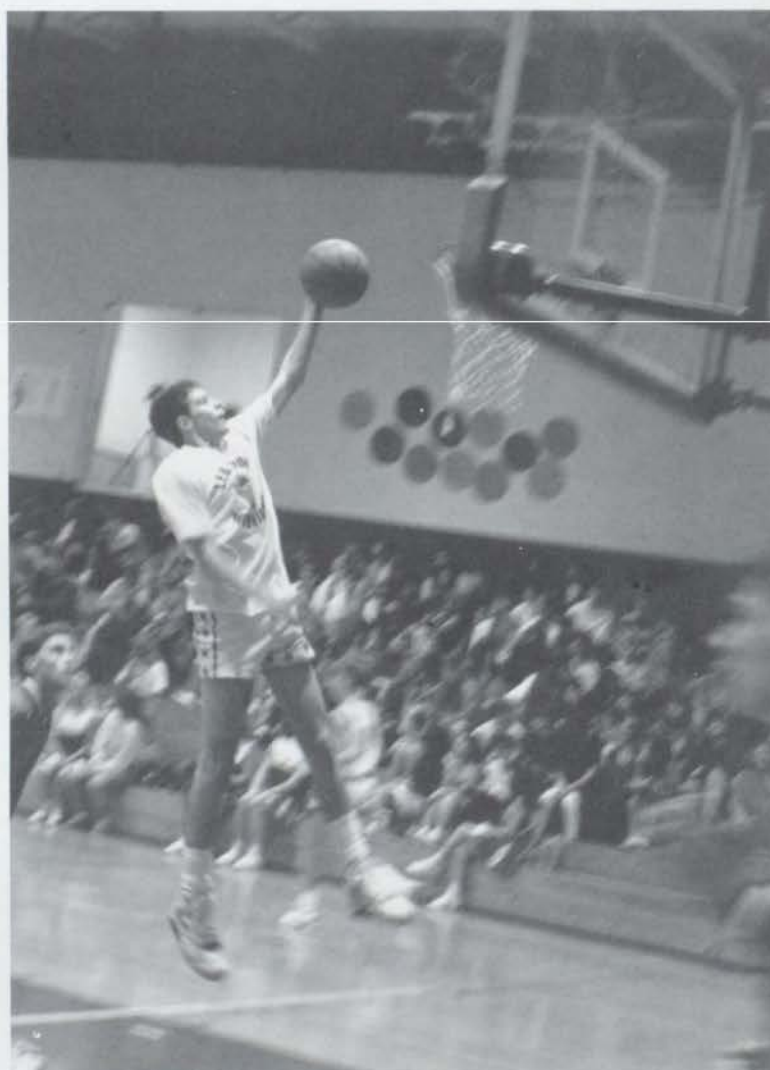
The J.V. Boys also had an outstanding season, they were 14-8.

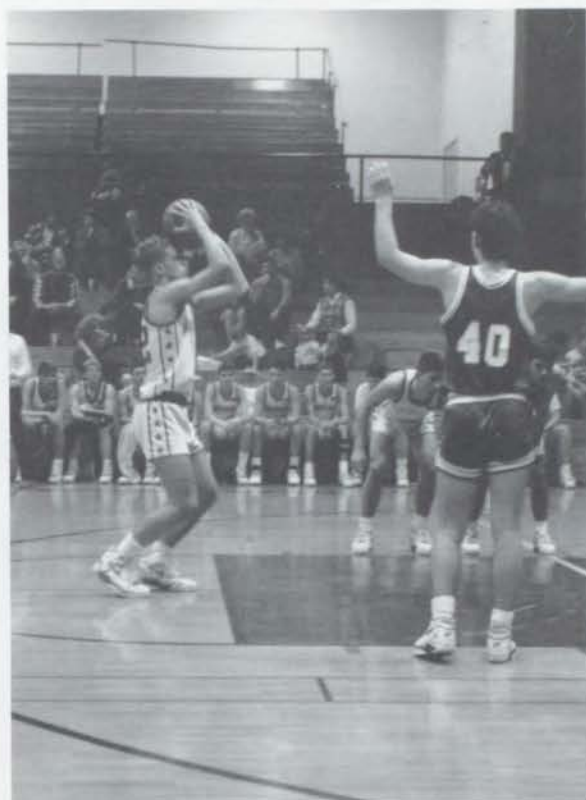

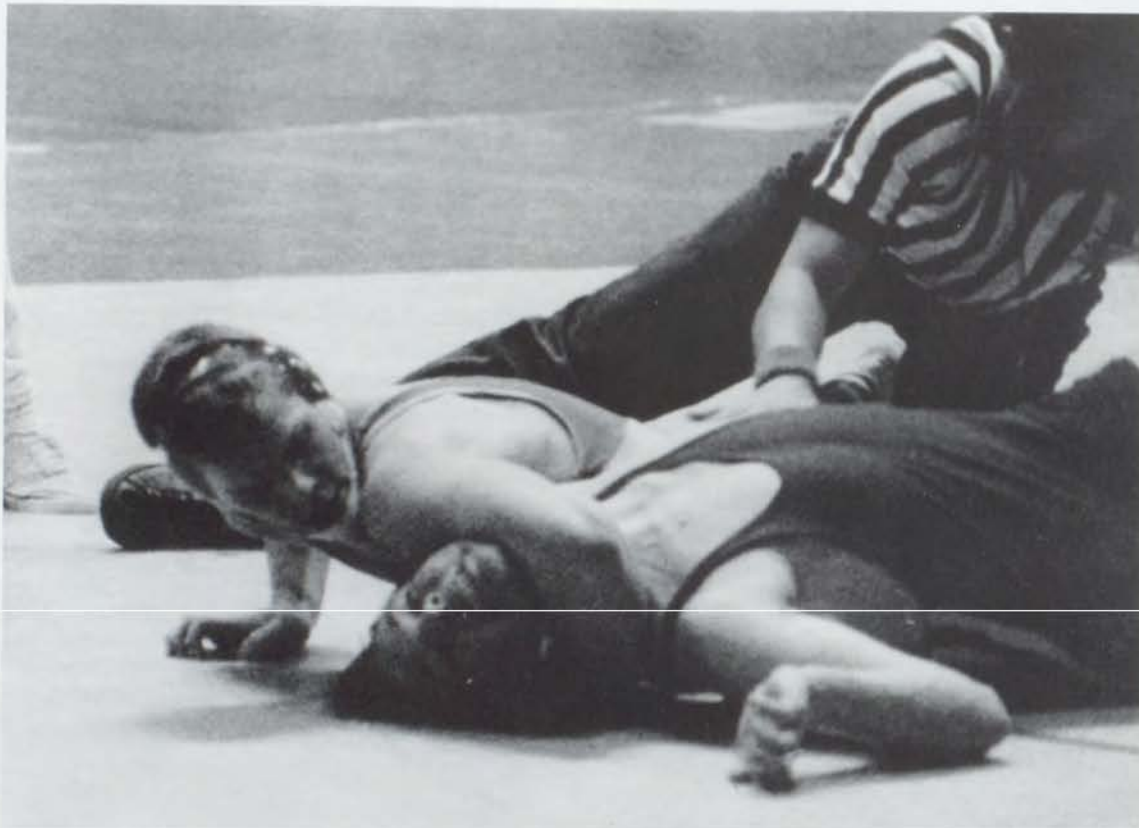

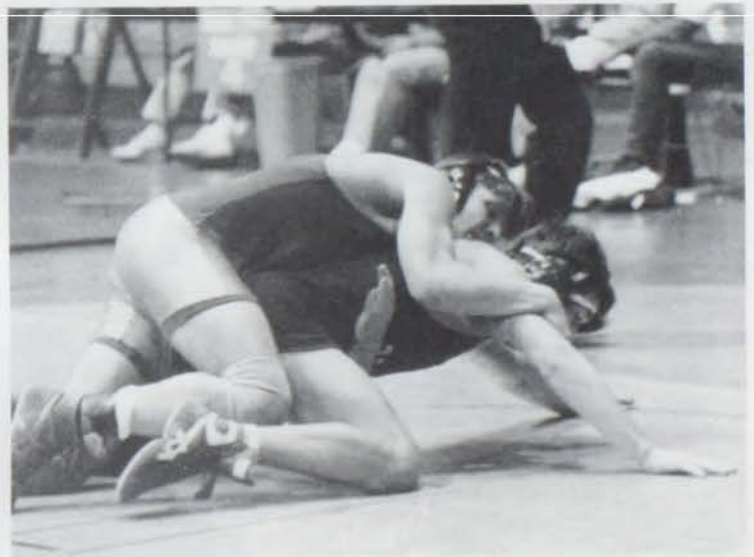

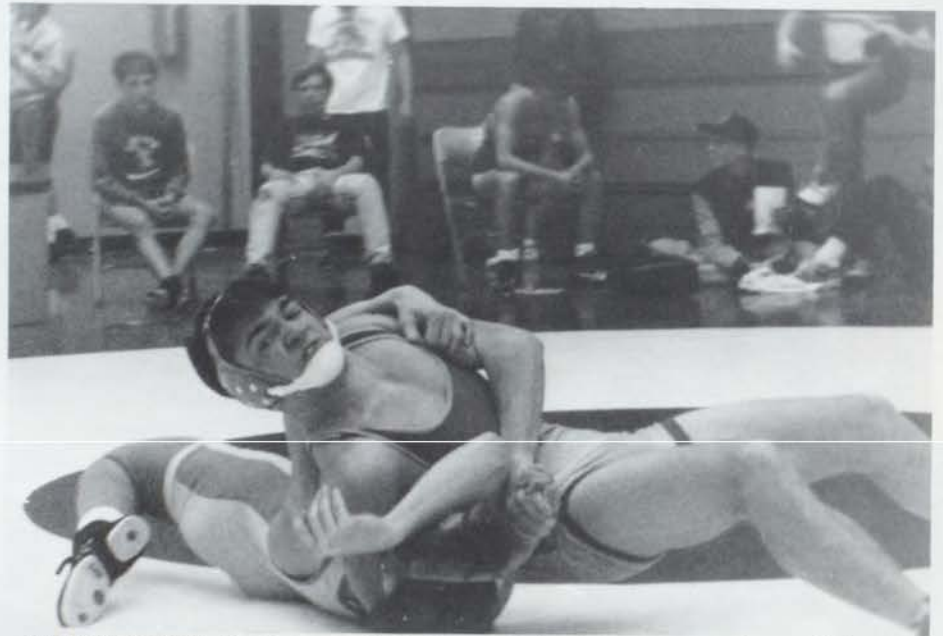

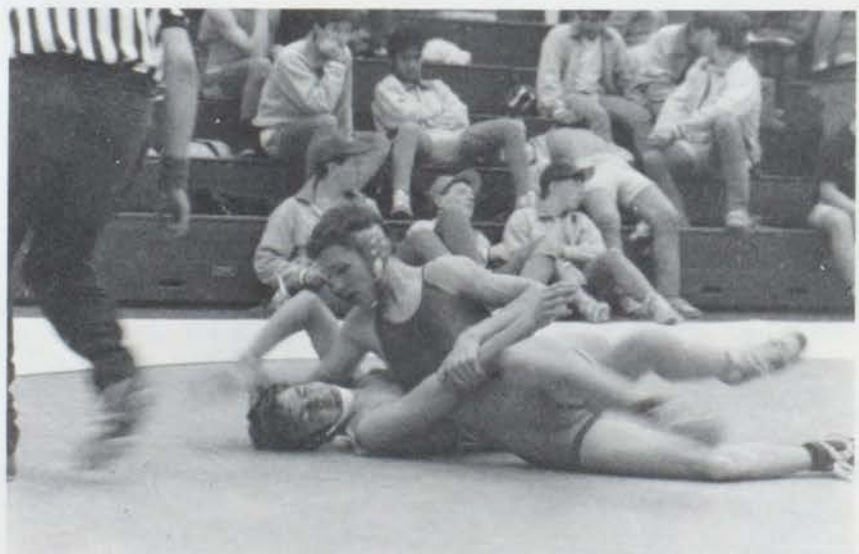

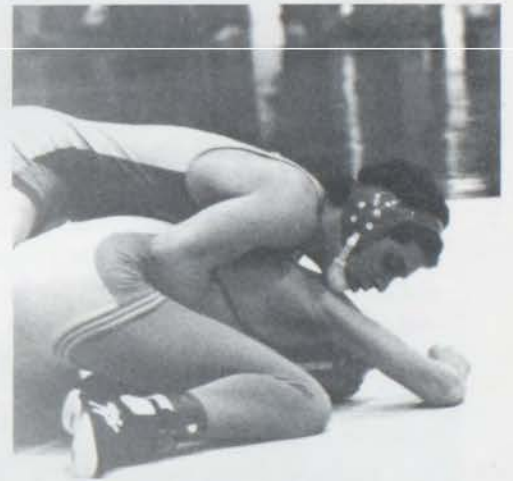

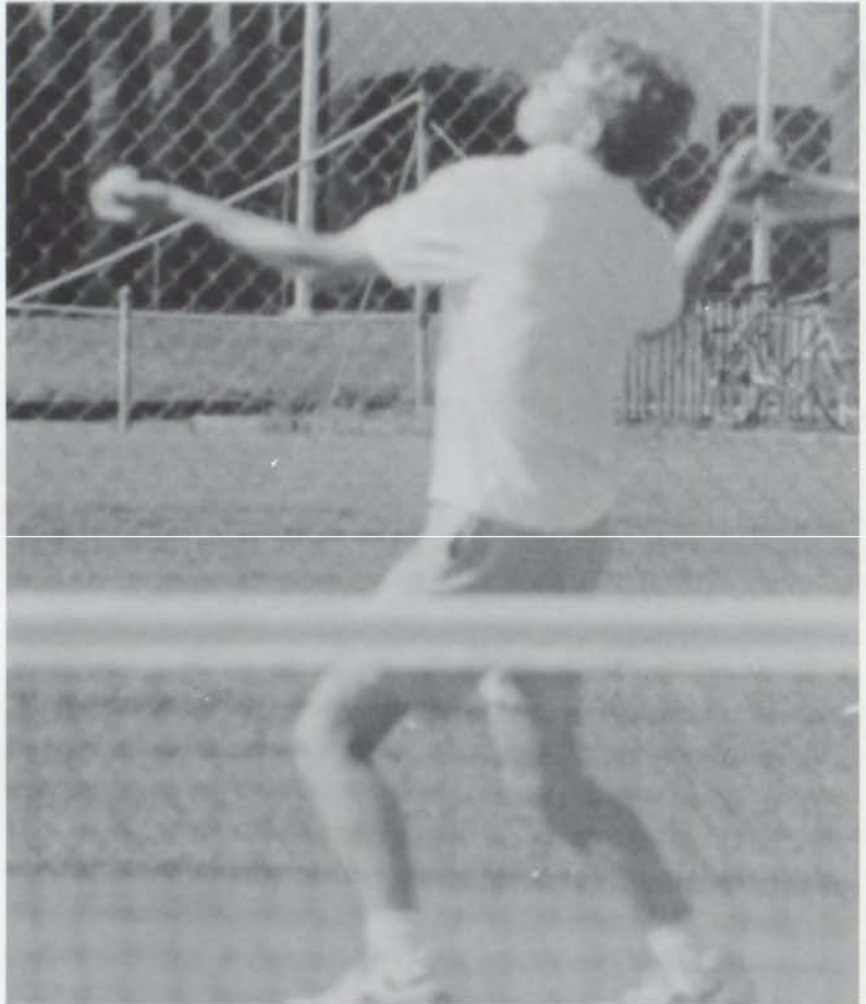

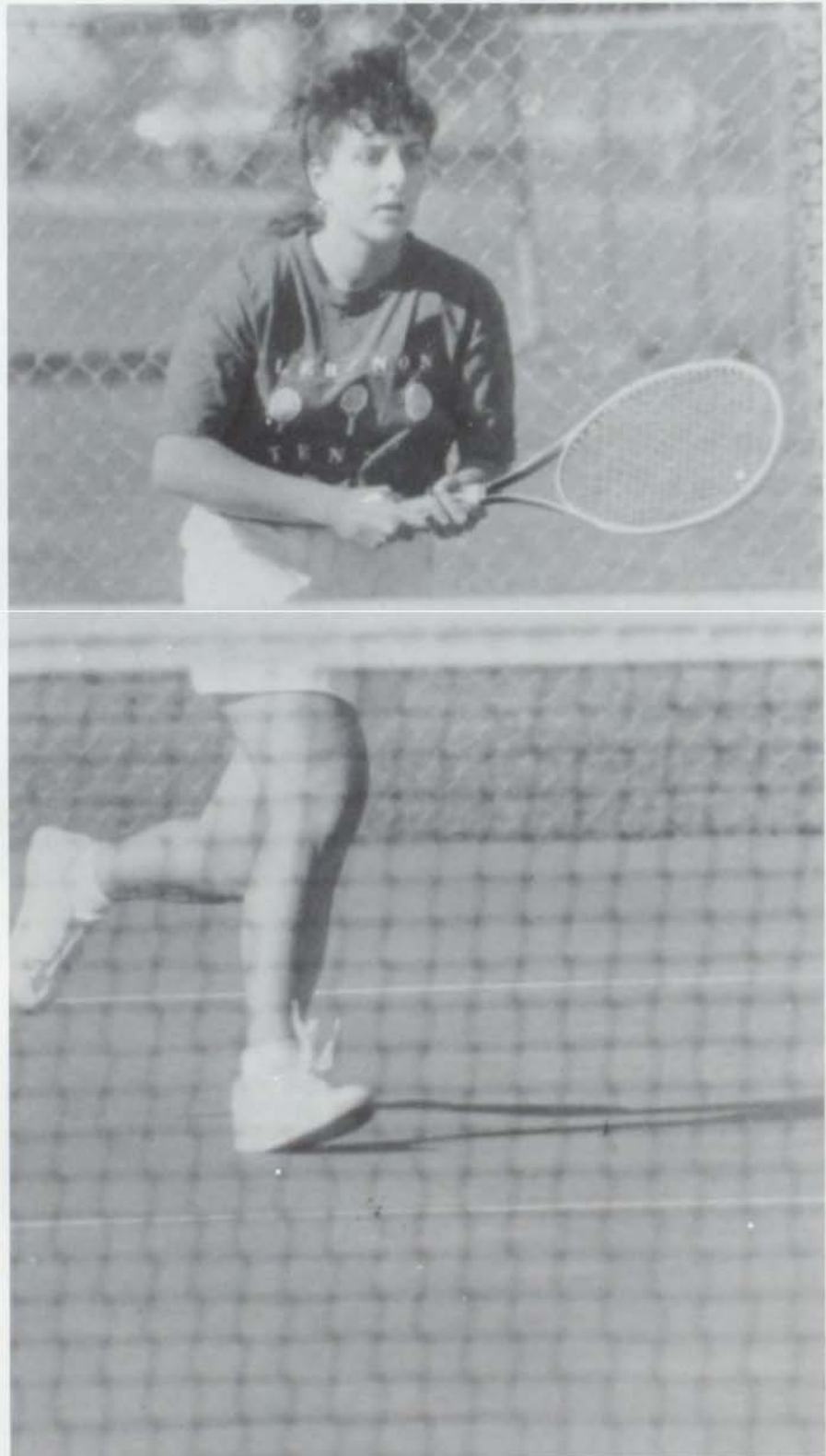
NEWLY

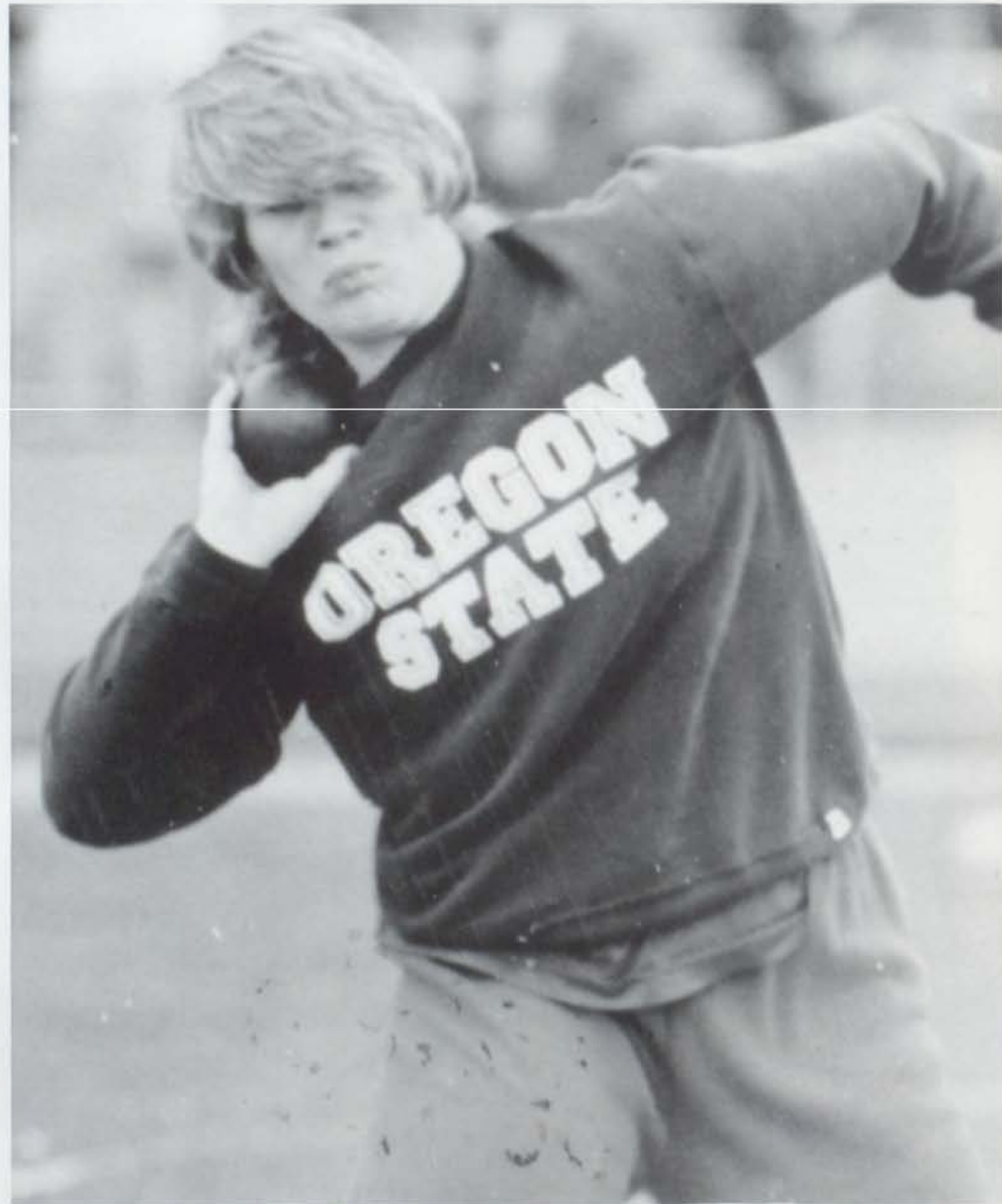

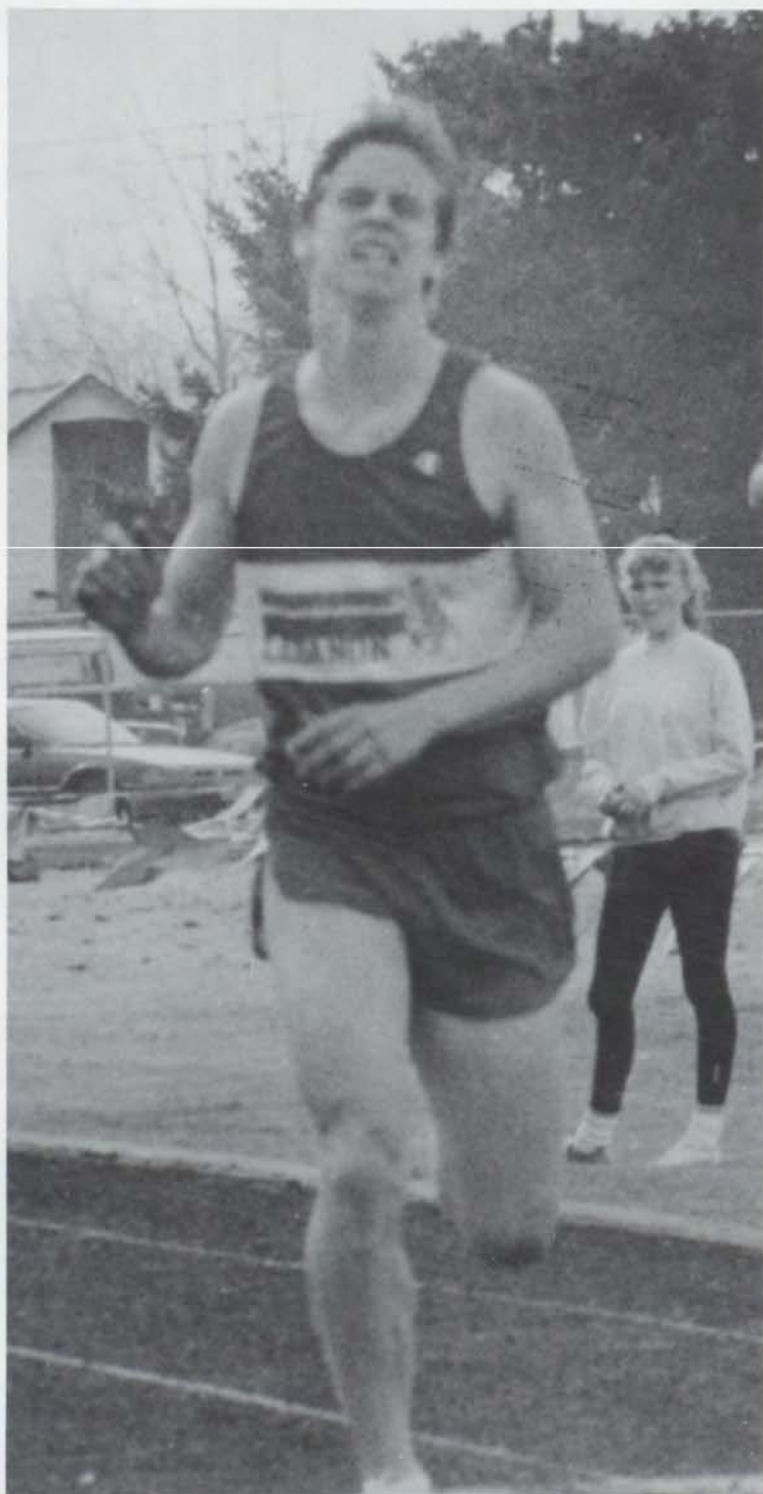

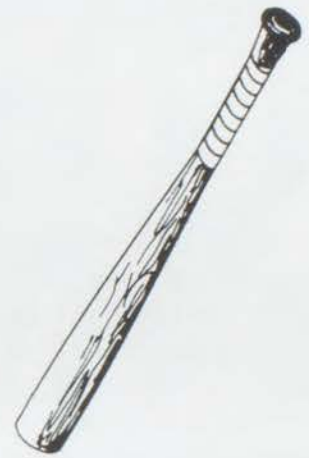

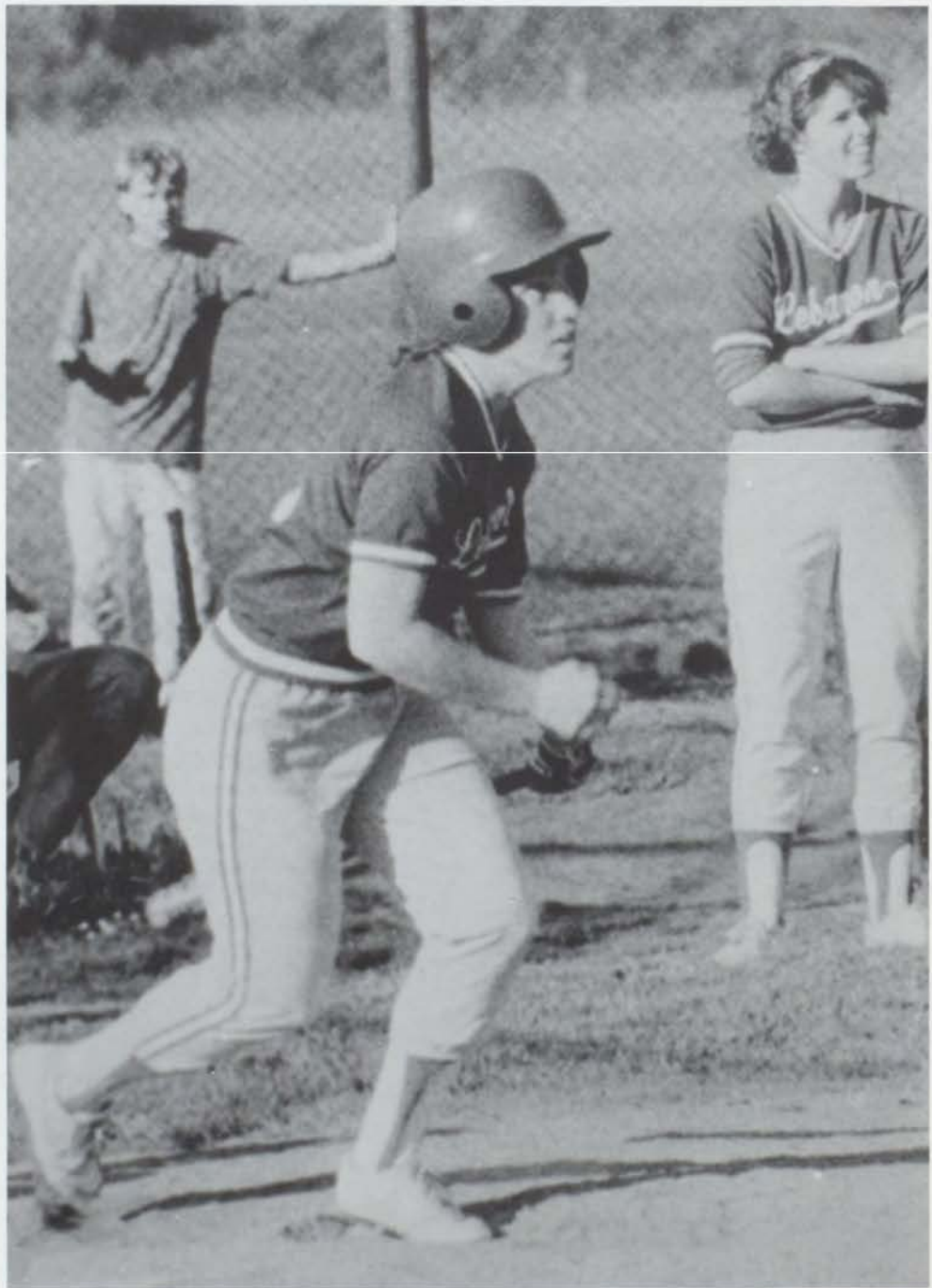

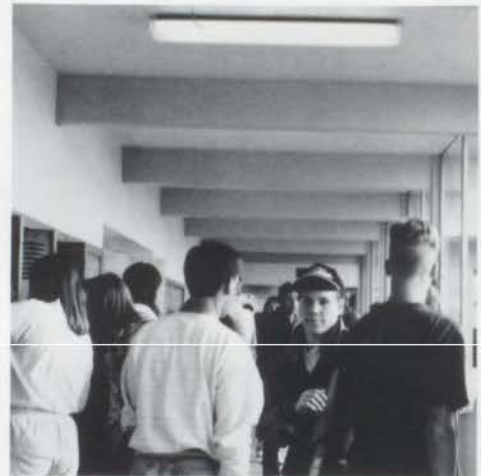

Brandi Branton, a senior Anatomy student had this to say about her class, "It's a very interesting class and you learn a lot about your body and the way it works."

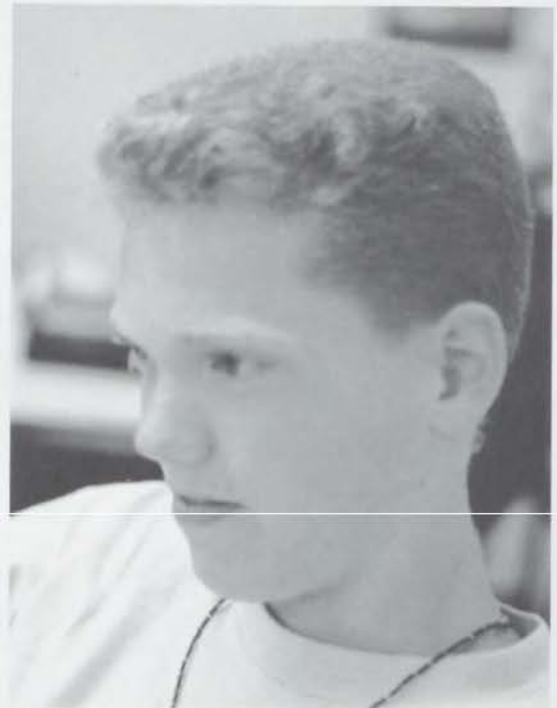
At the same time the science classes were preparing for labs, tests and homework assignments, the math students were working hard to figure out one equation after another.

Spanish students took a look at Spanish and Mexican ways of life when they made pinatas, learned about different foods and read stories written by Spanish authors.

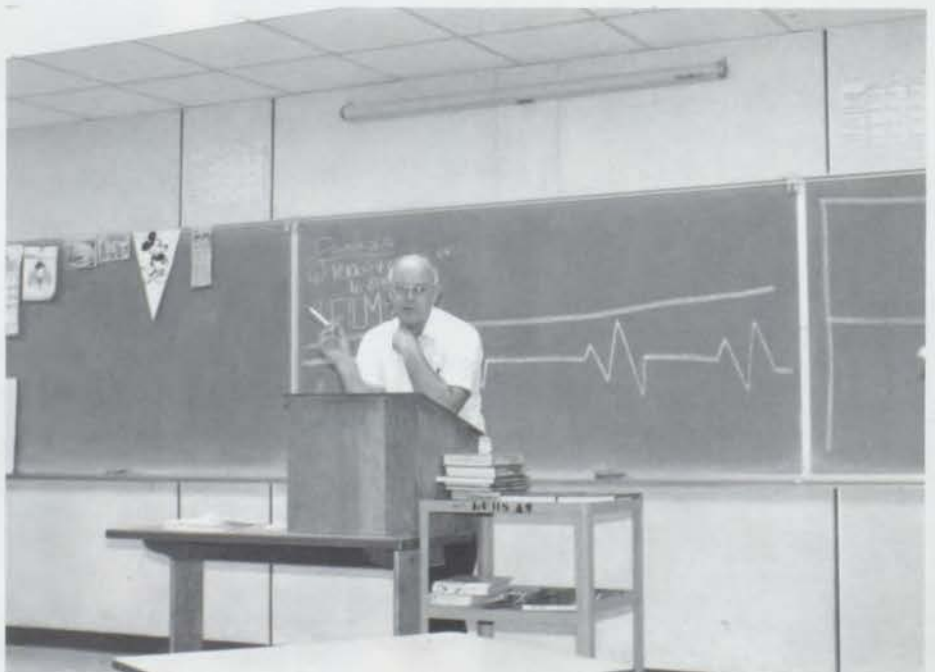

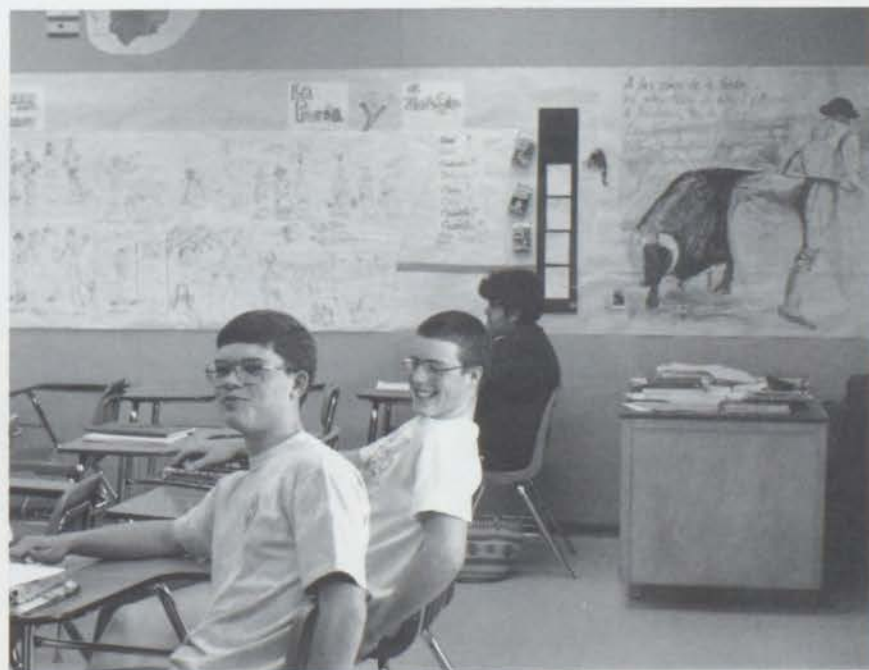

Jennifer Murphy said, "Marching and going to competitions is what I like best about band."

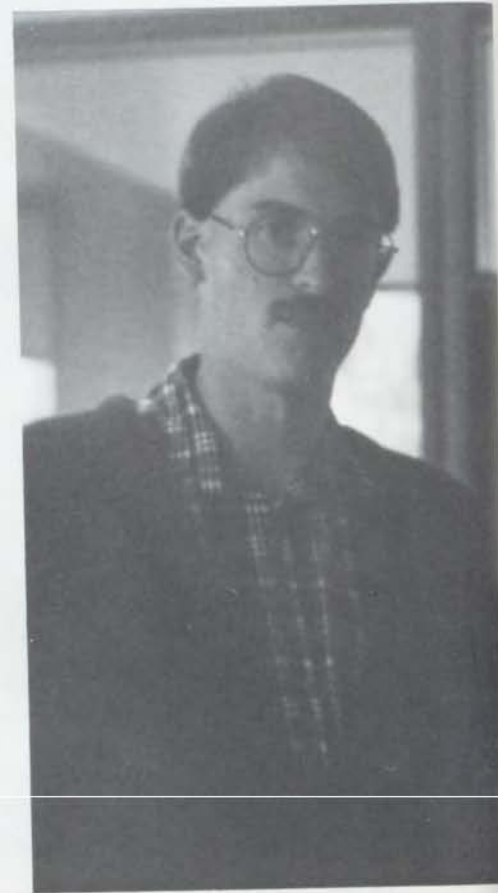
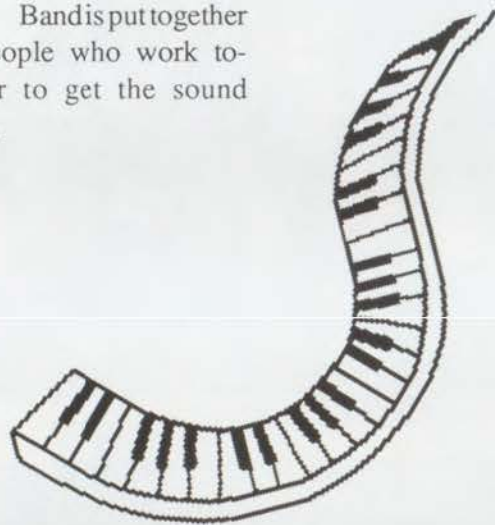

Band is put together by people who work together to get the sound right..



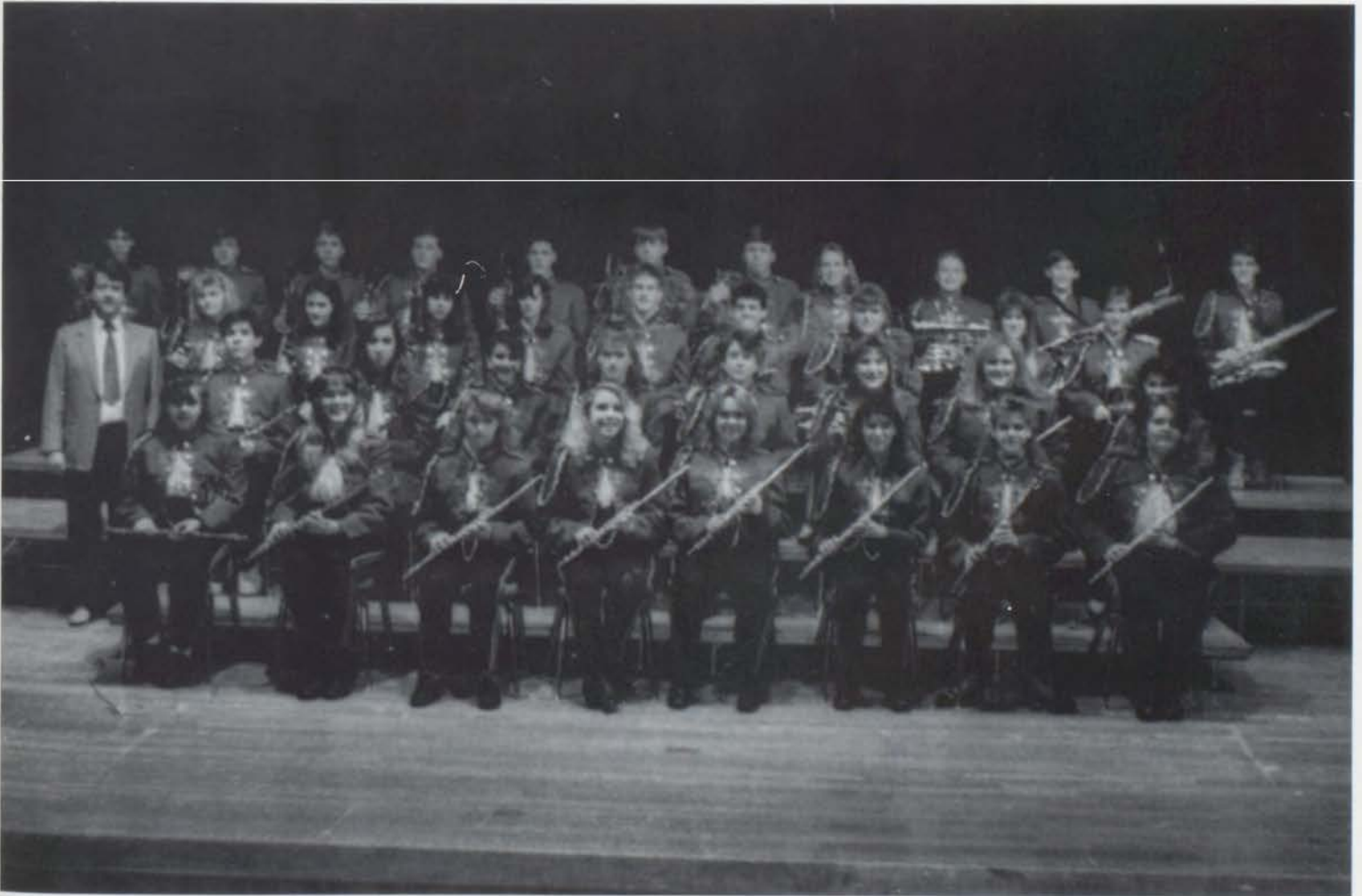

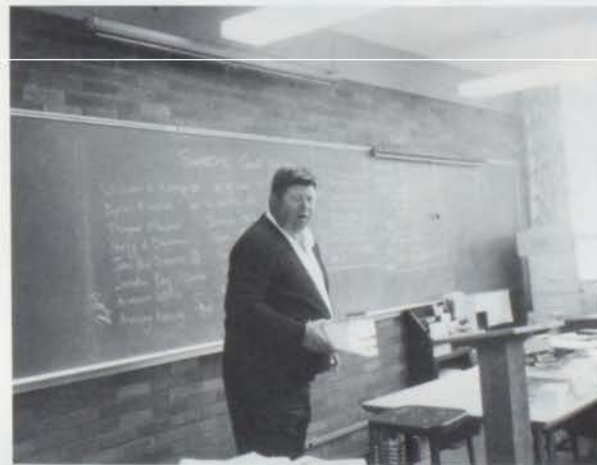

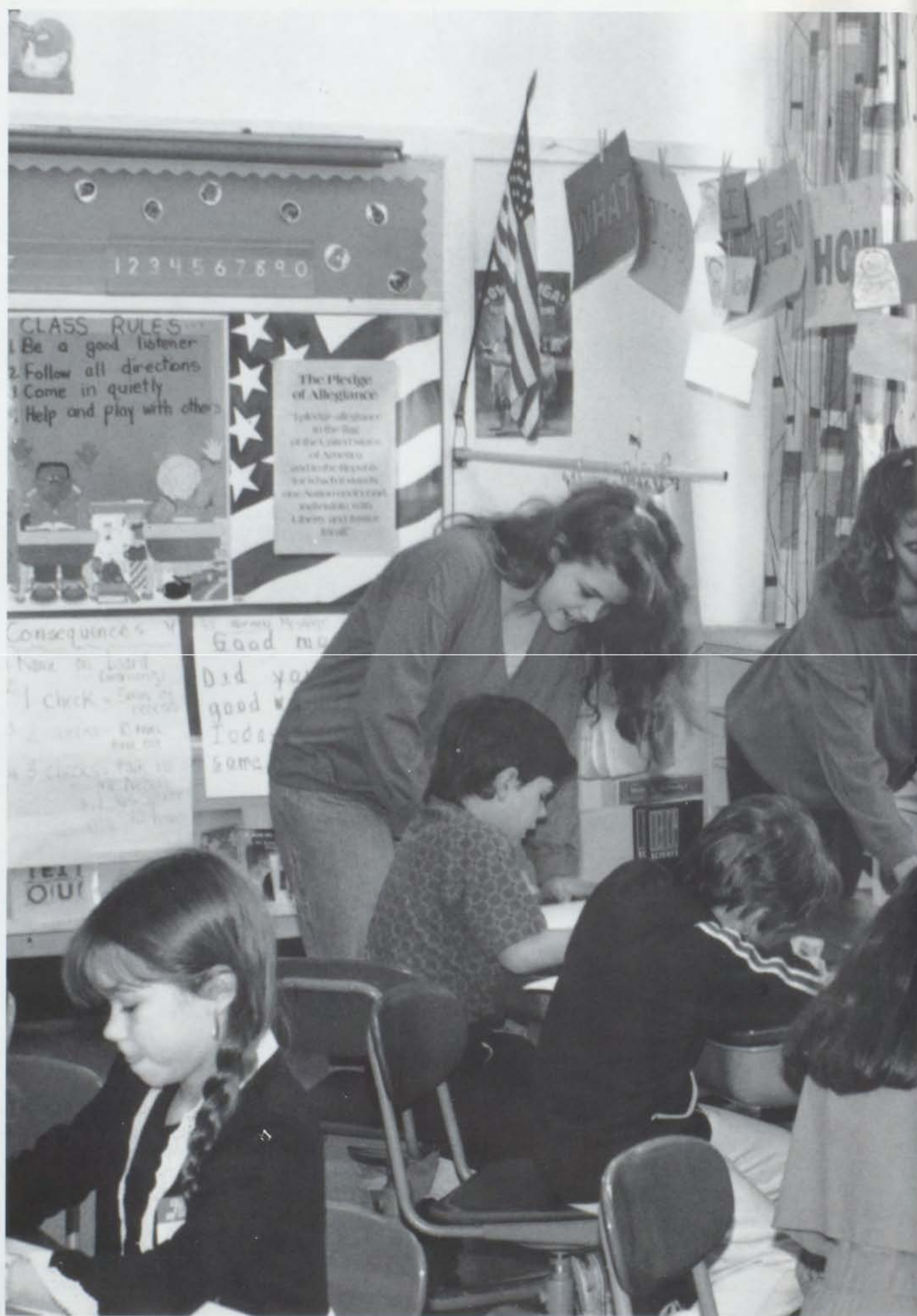

Carpentry is another club that helps students work toward their career goals.

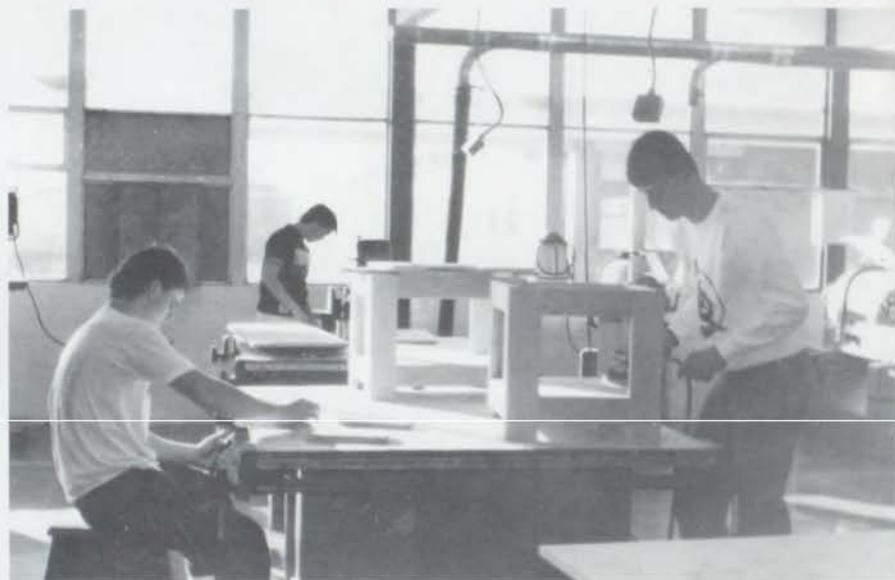
There were many interesting ways to show their creative talents. President Jeff Vandiver says, "It is a really fun class."

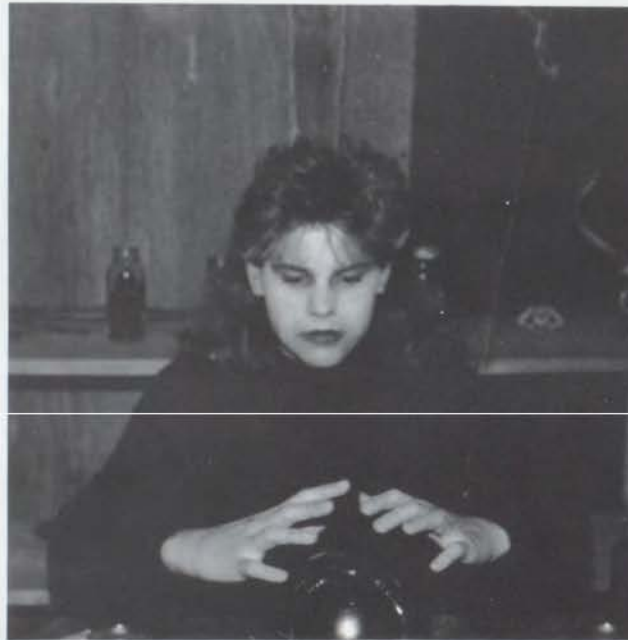
Stephanie Watkins said "It's a really good feeling knowing that you've gotten through to a few of those kids about the importance of saying 'NO' to drugs and alcohol."

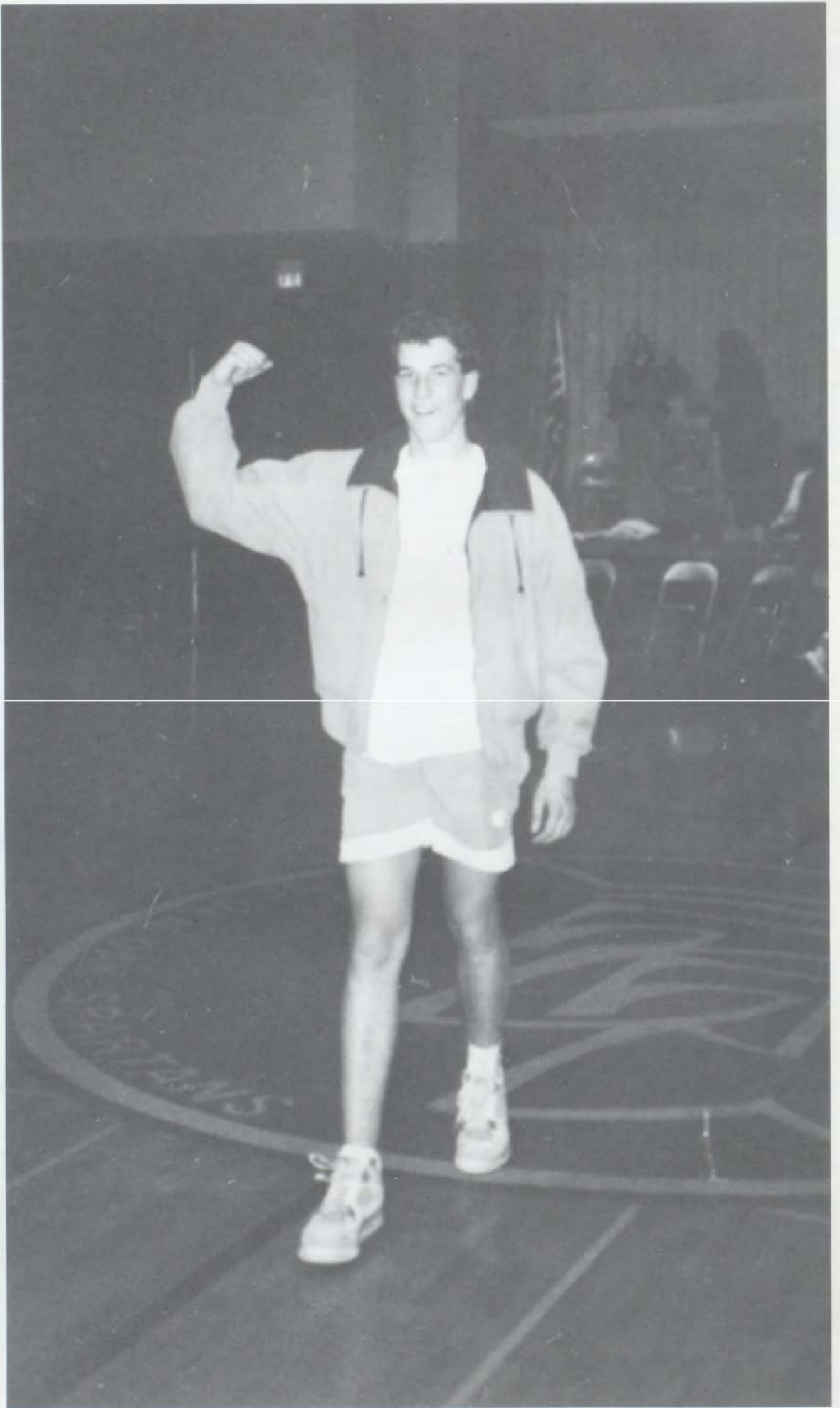
