The noon activities were a huge success this year with activities such as crazy hair styles. The guys did some serious styling using things such as moose, hairspray, and TAPE!?!





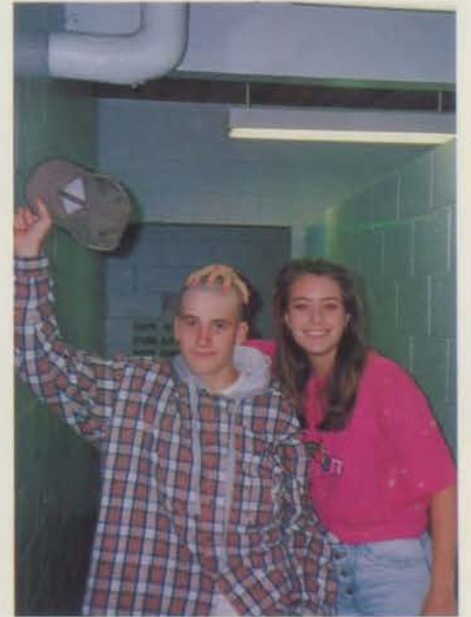

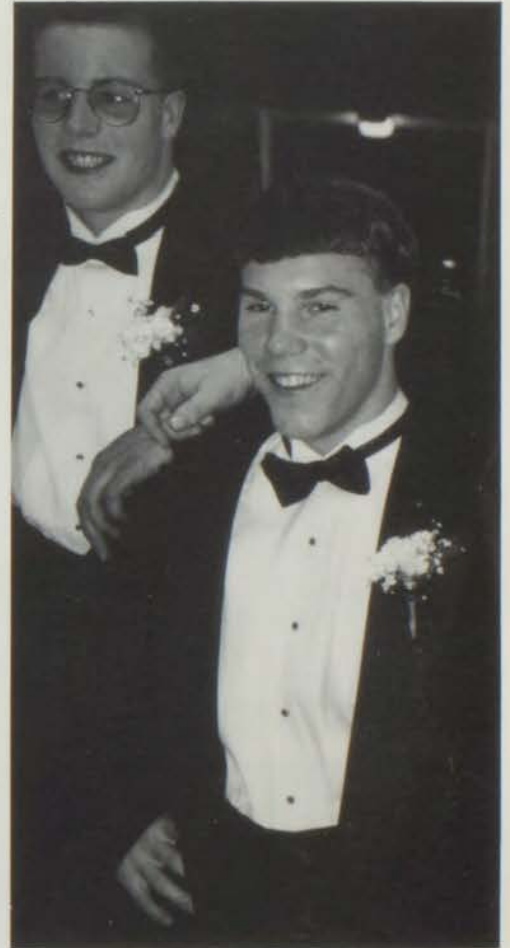

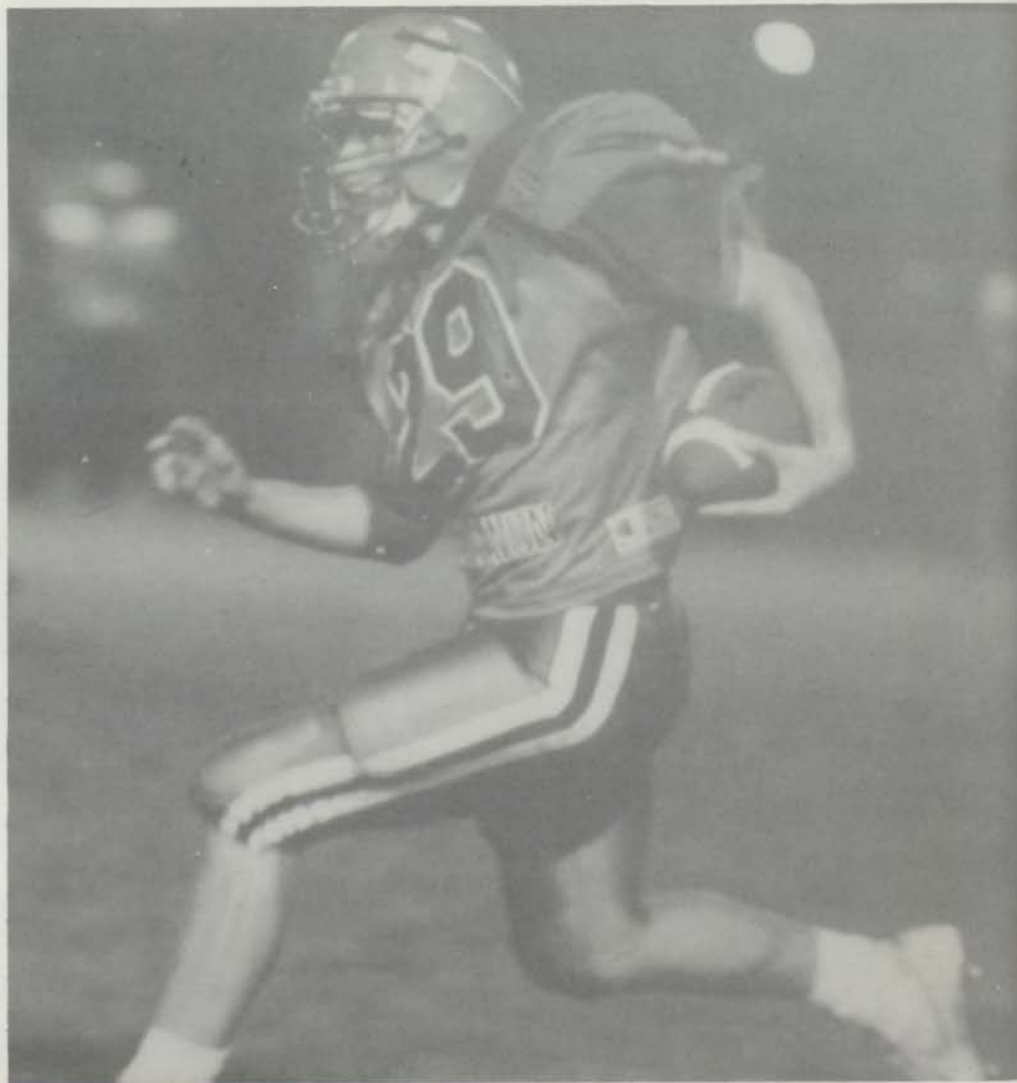

But the best aspect was summed up by Junior Holly Beeson when she said, "We worked well as a team and had lots of spirit."



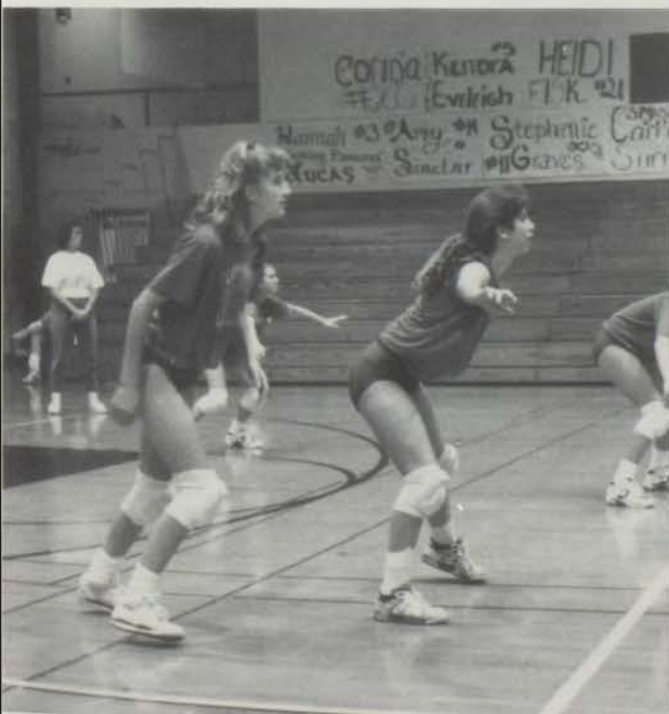

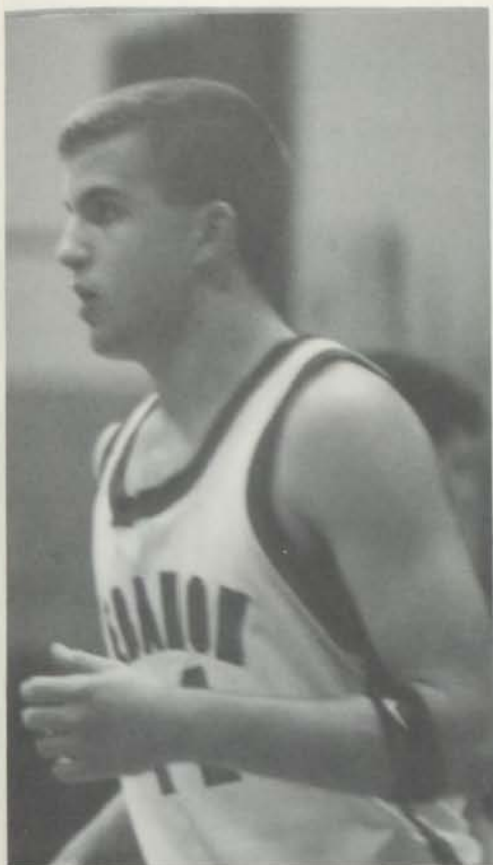

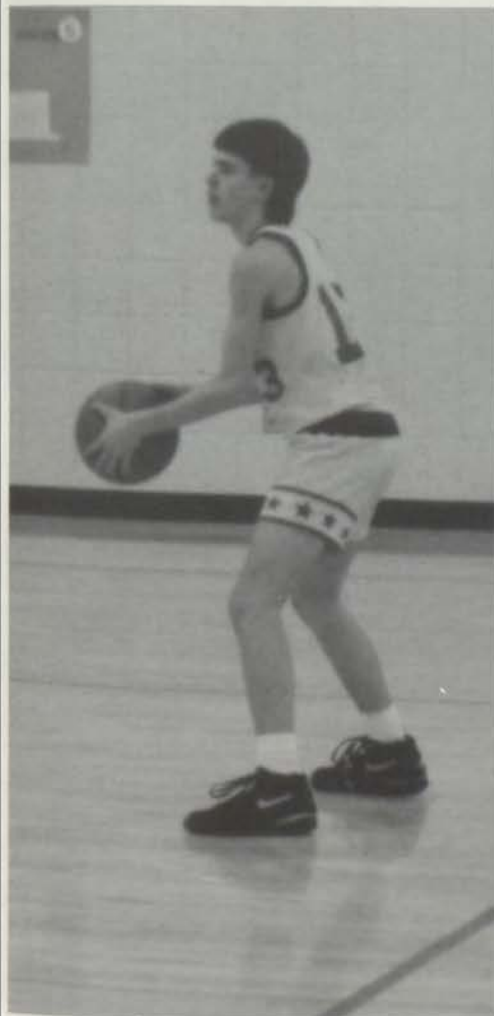

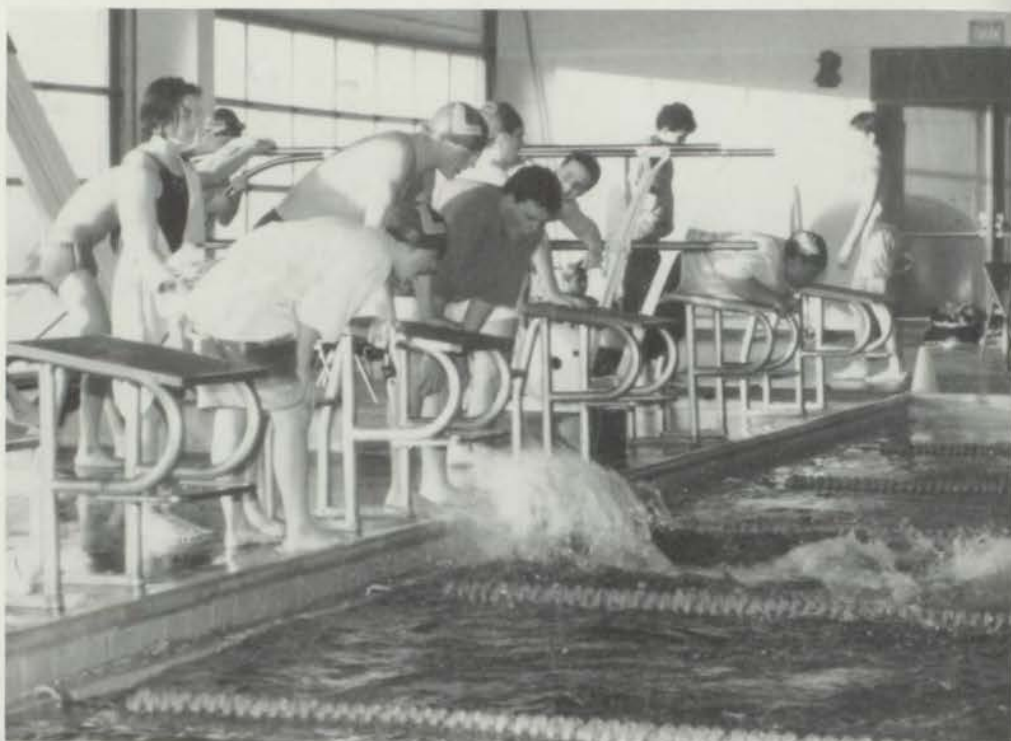

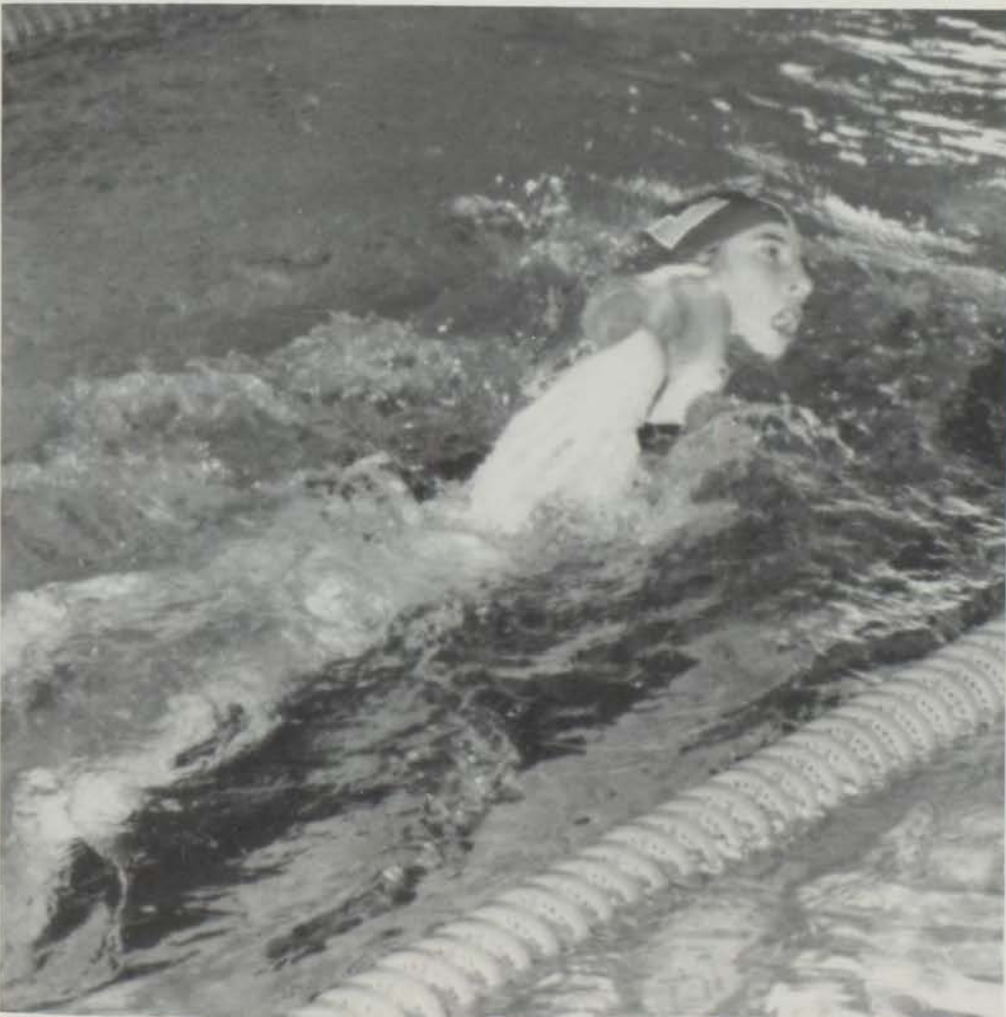

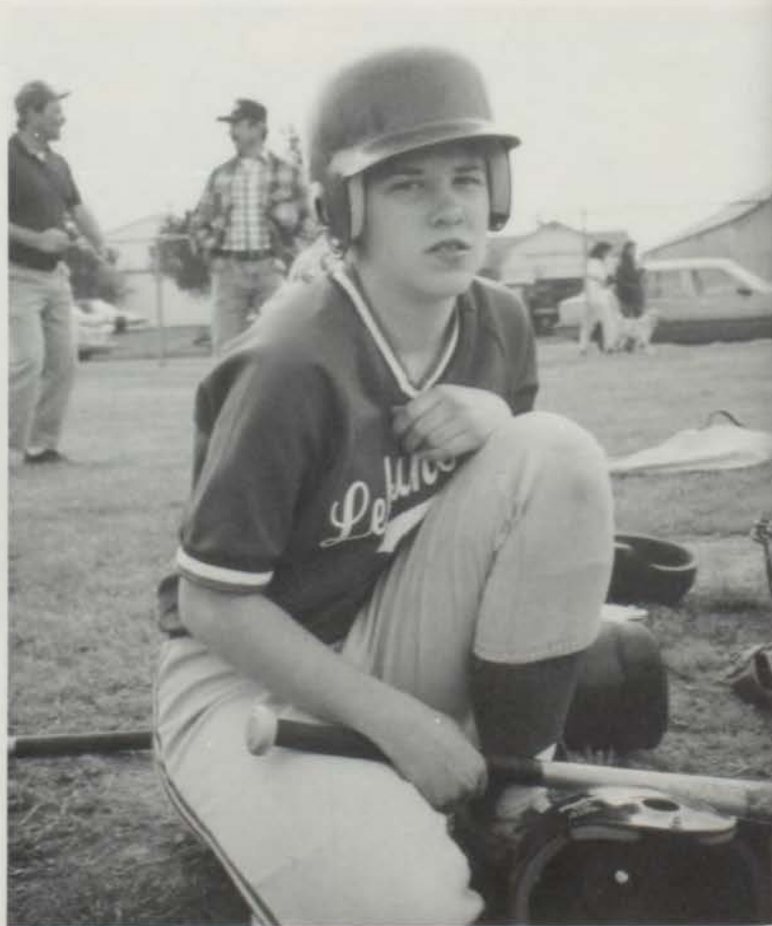

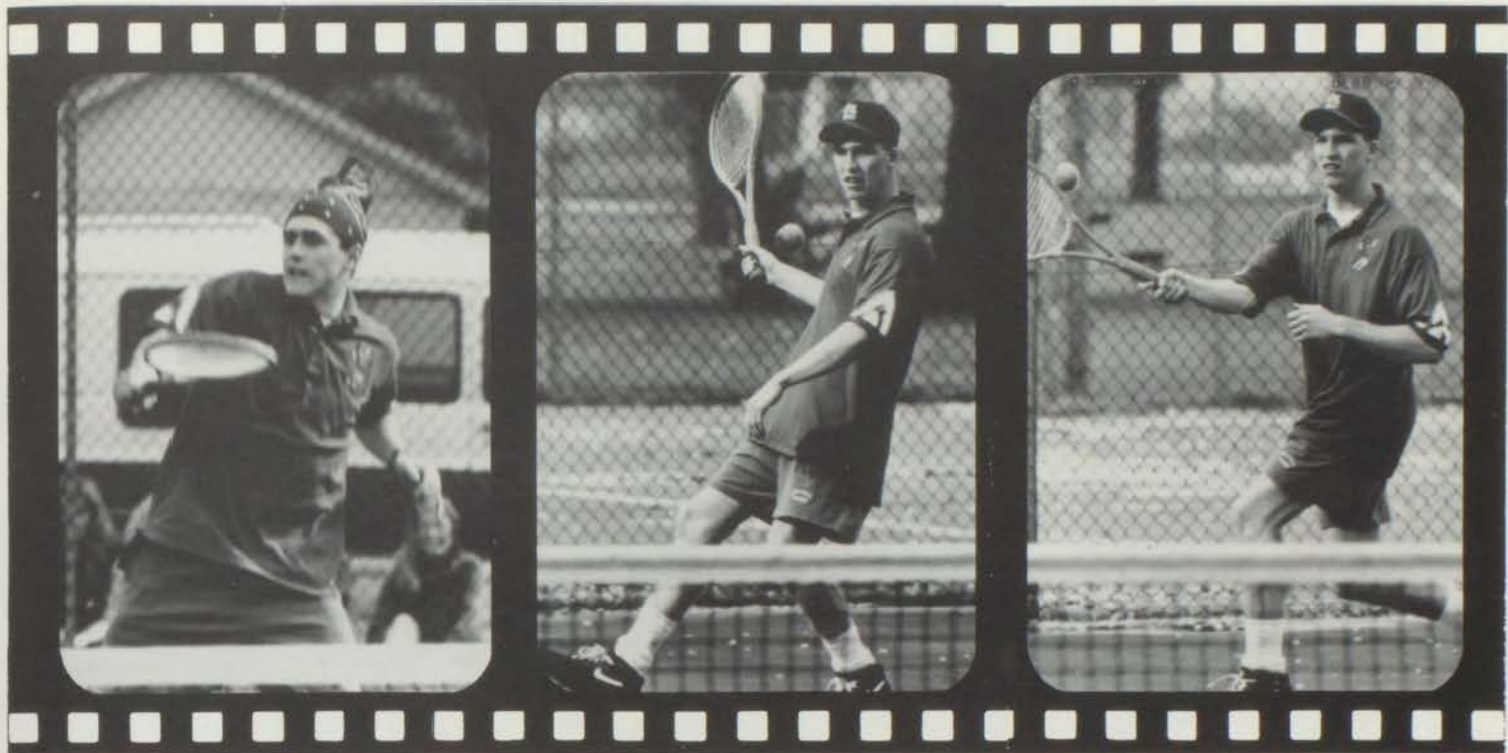

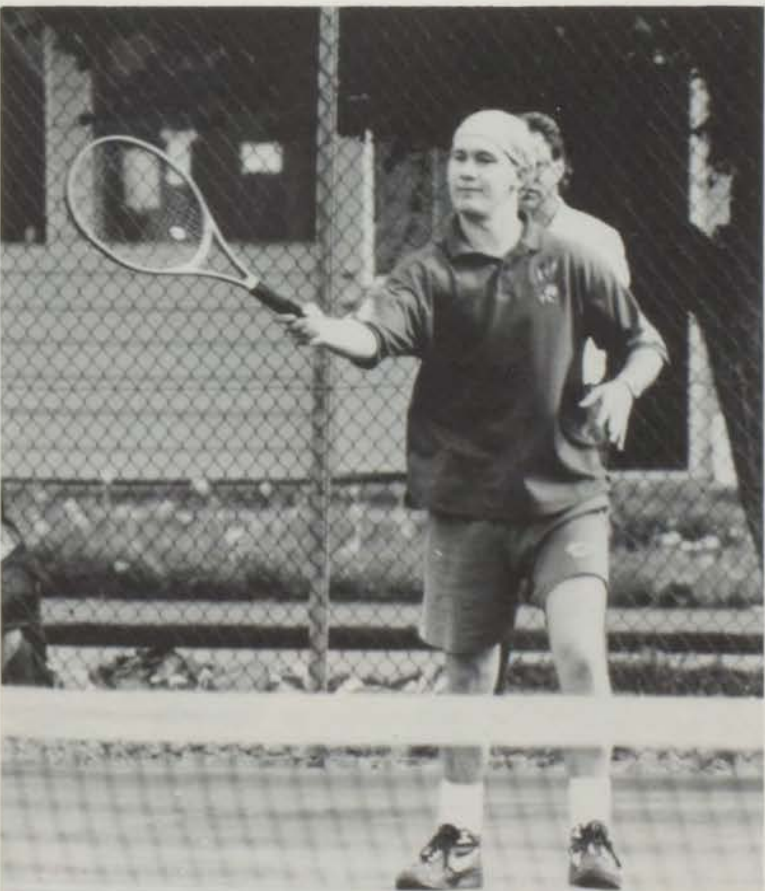

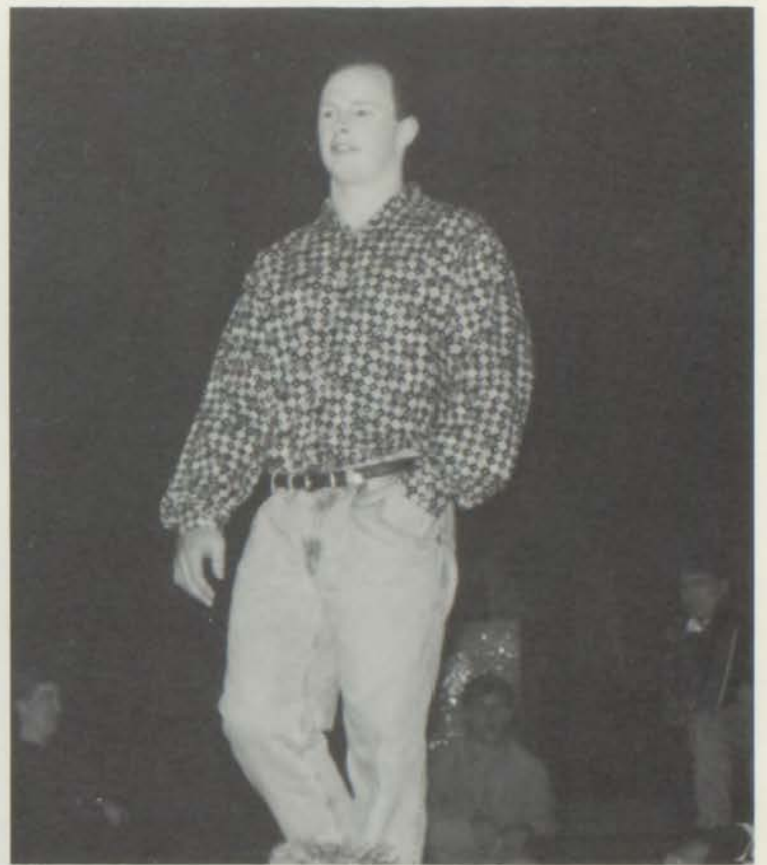

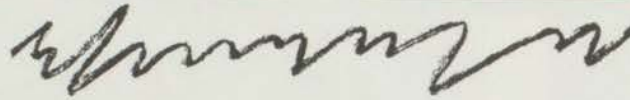

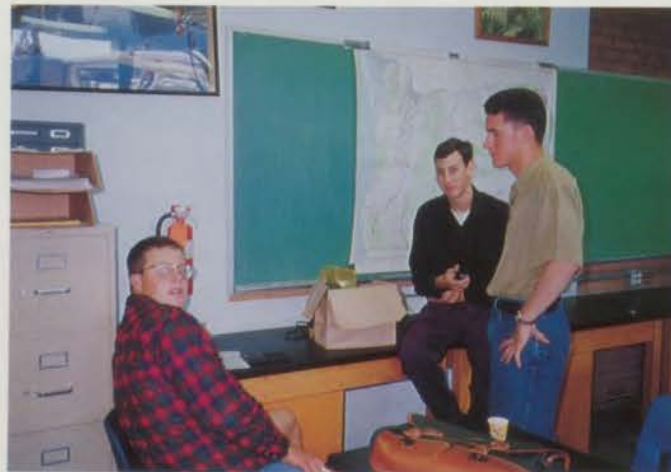

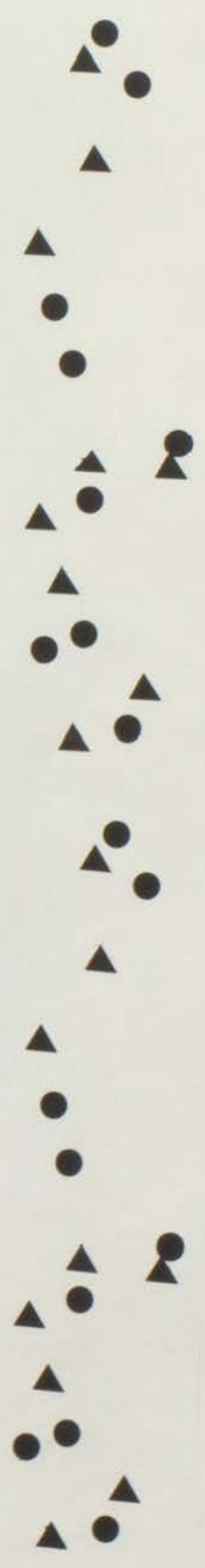

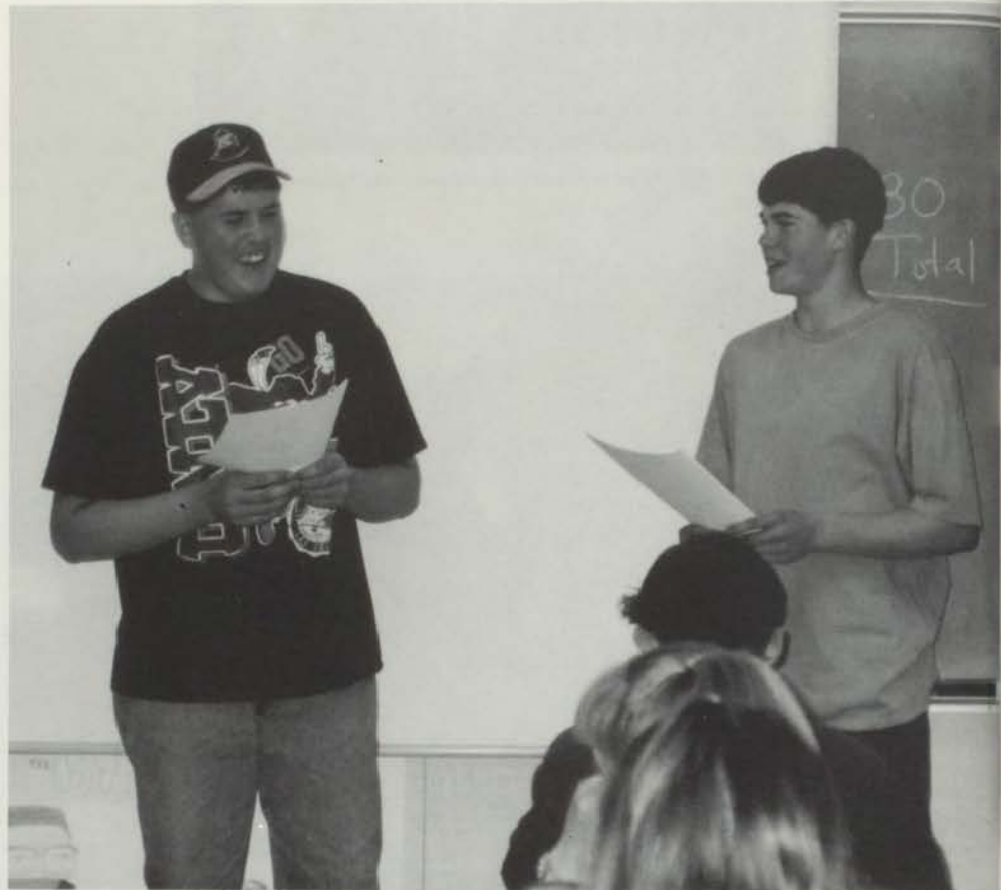

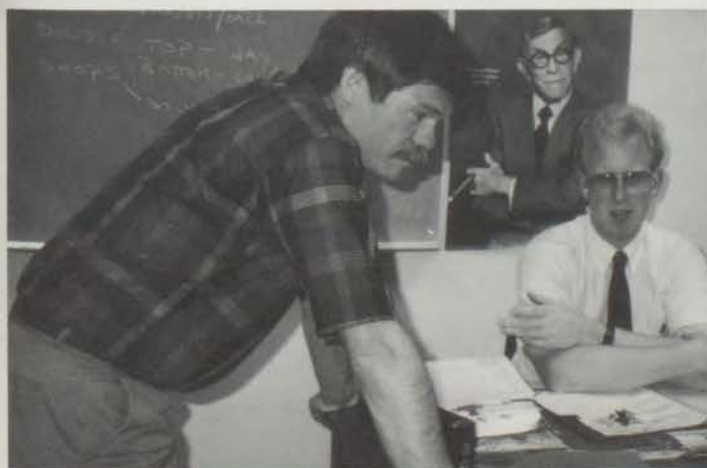
