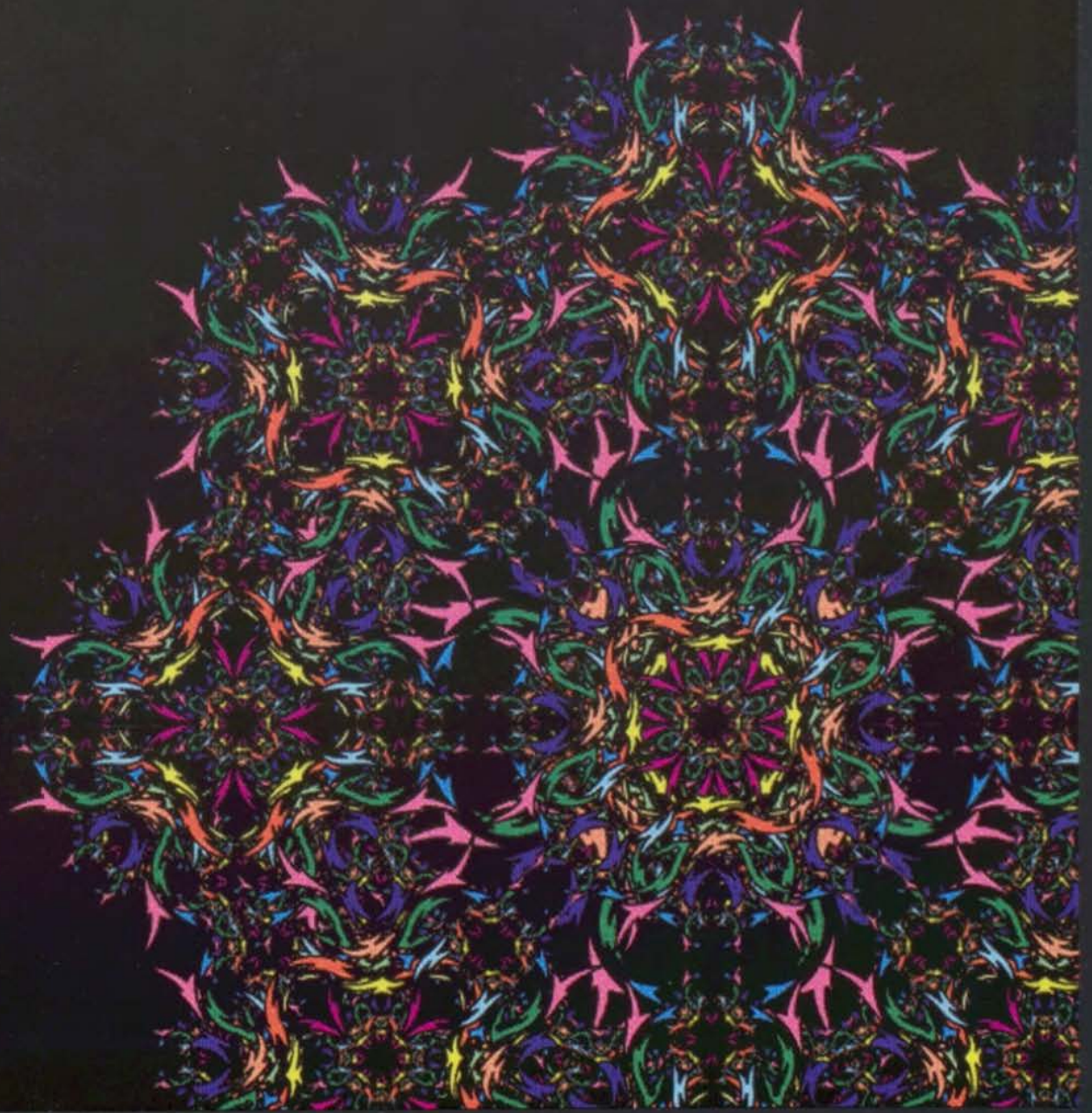
Six hundred books were sold at a cost of \$50 before January 6 and \$55 thereafter.

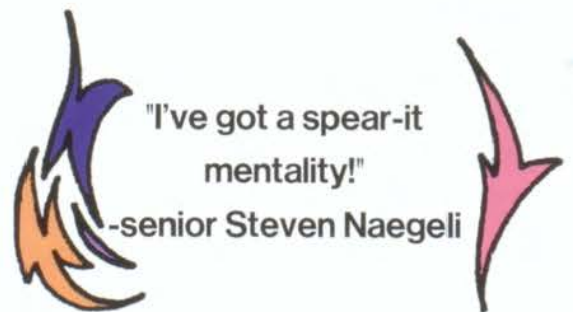

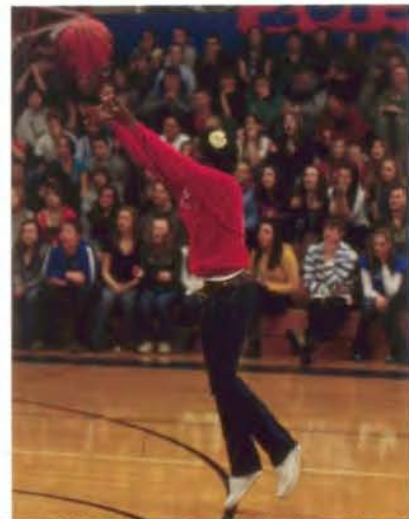

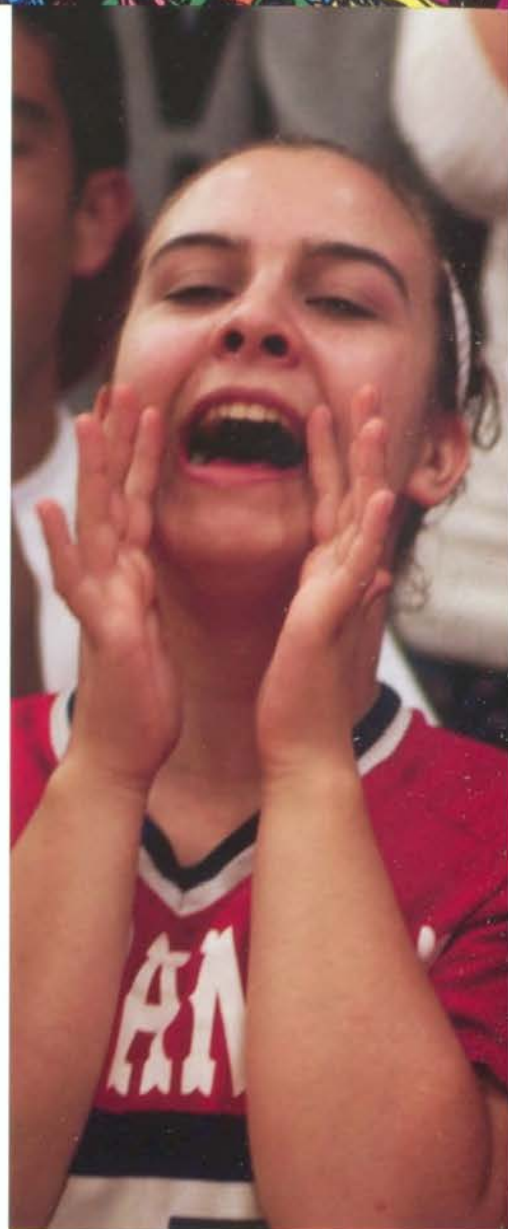
Homecoming

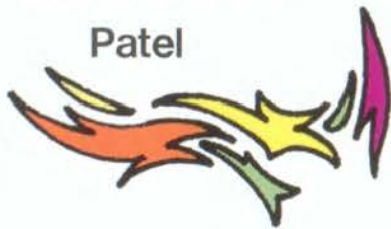

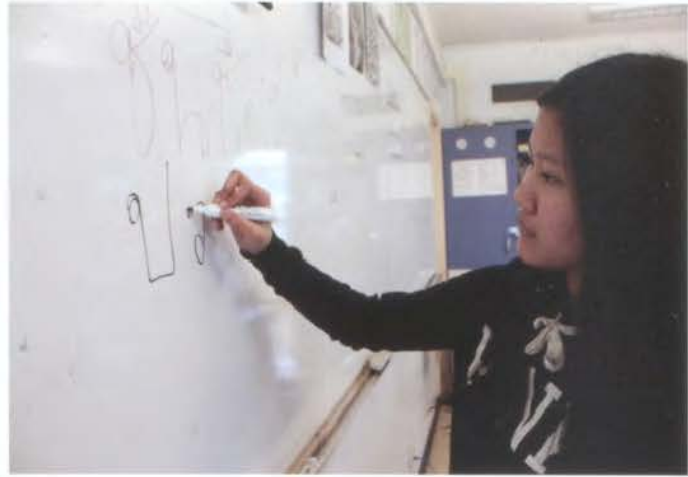

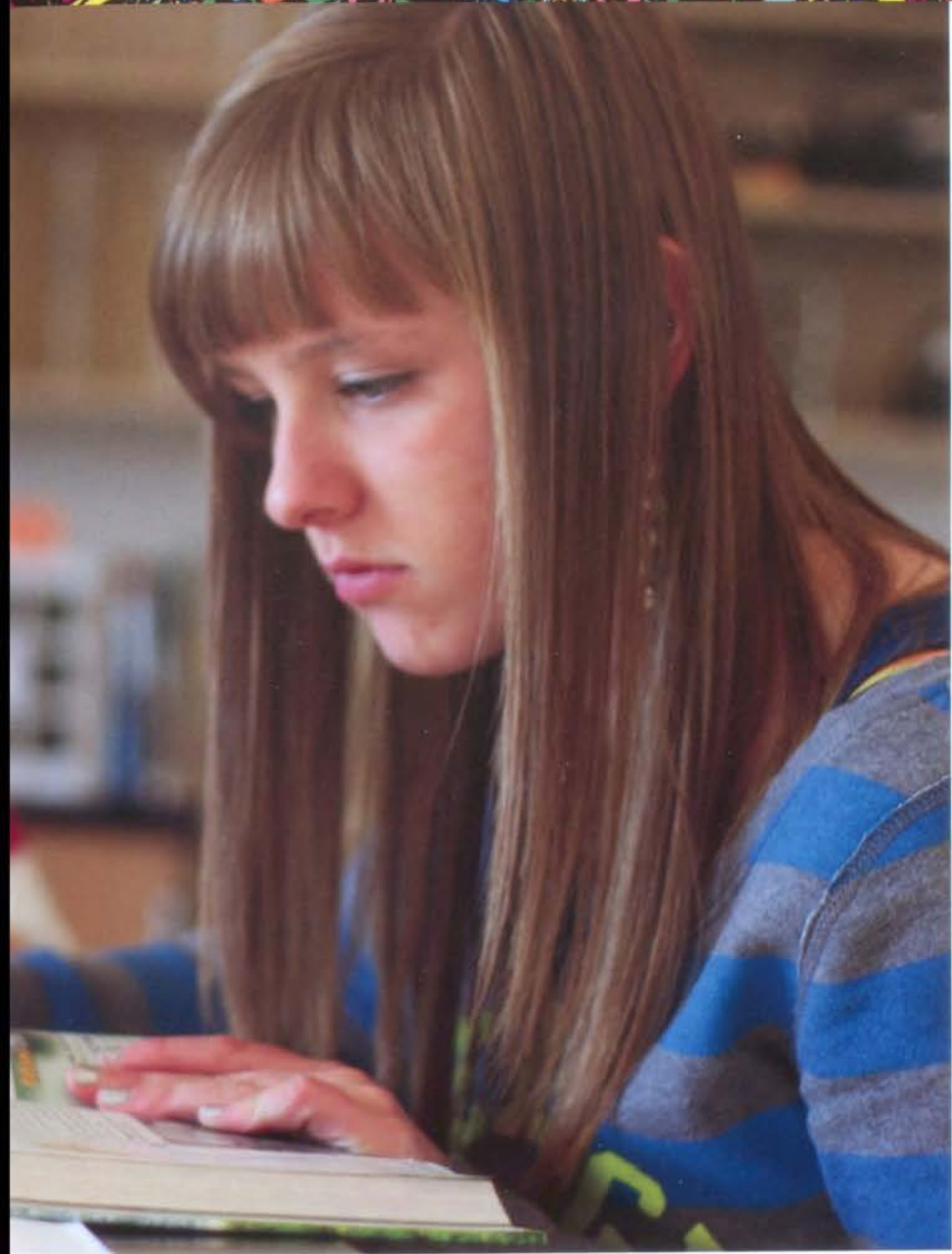

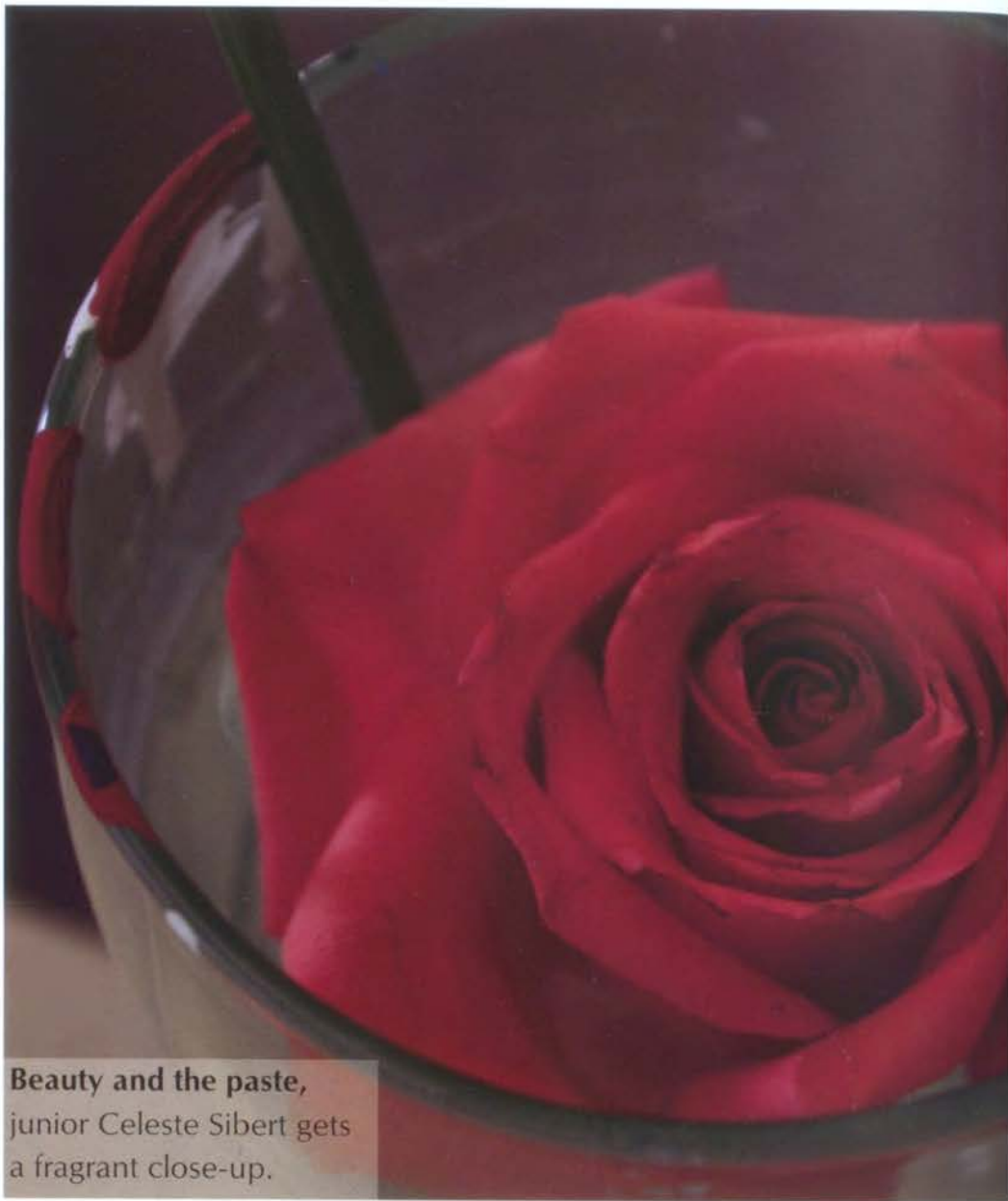

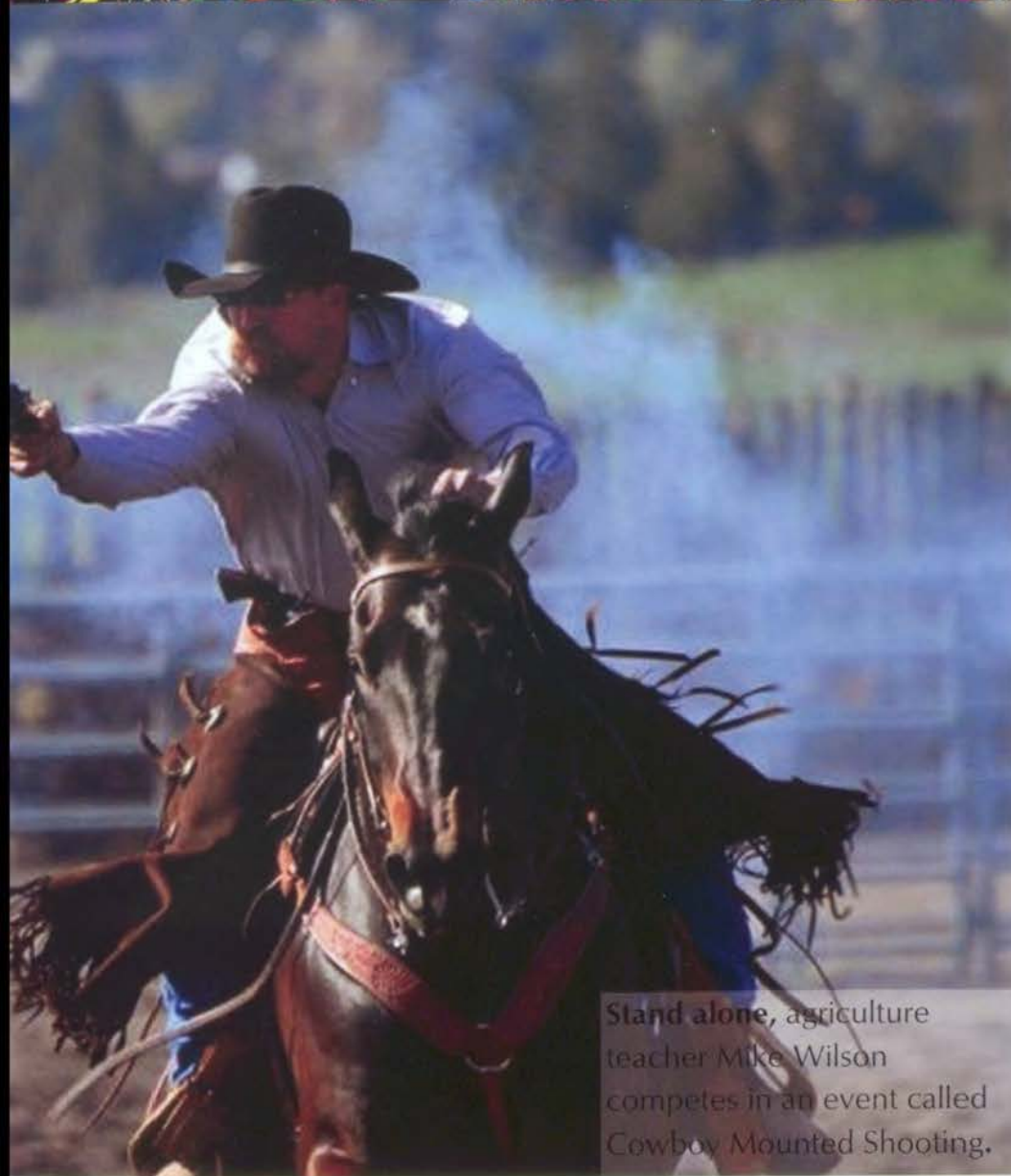

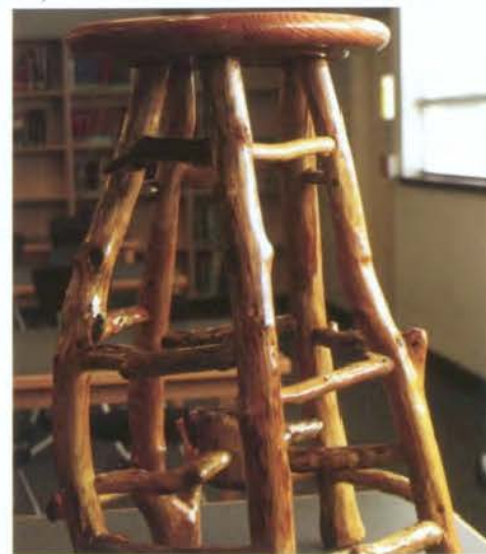

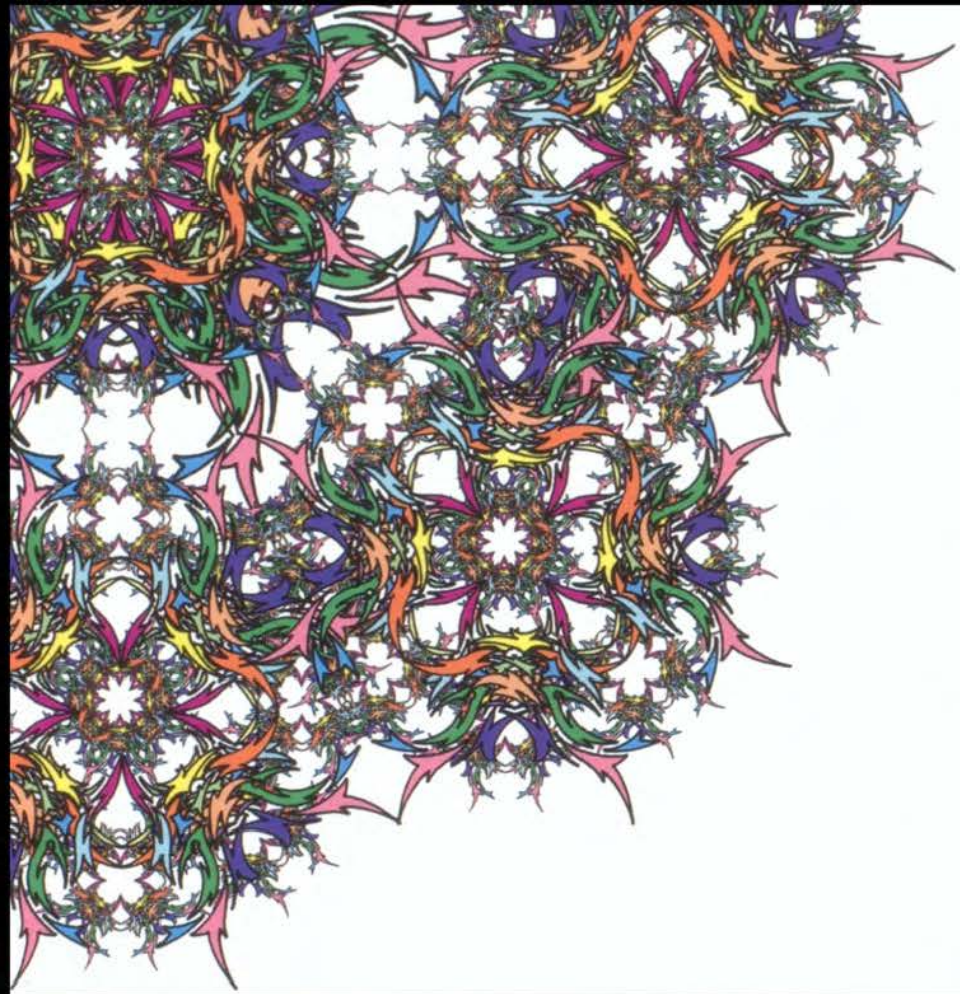

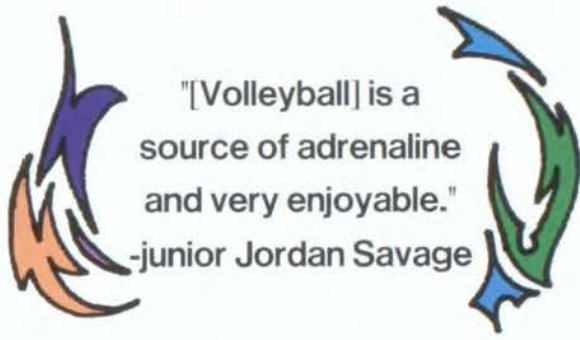

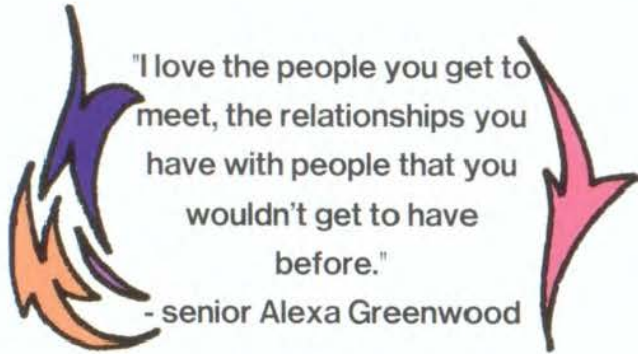

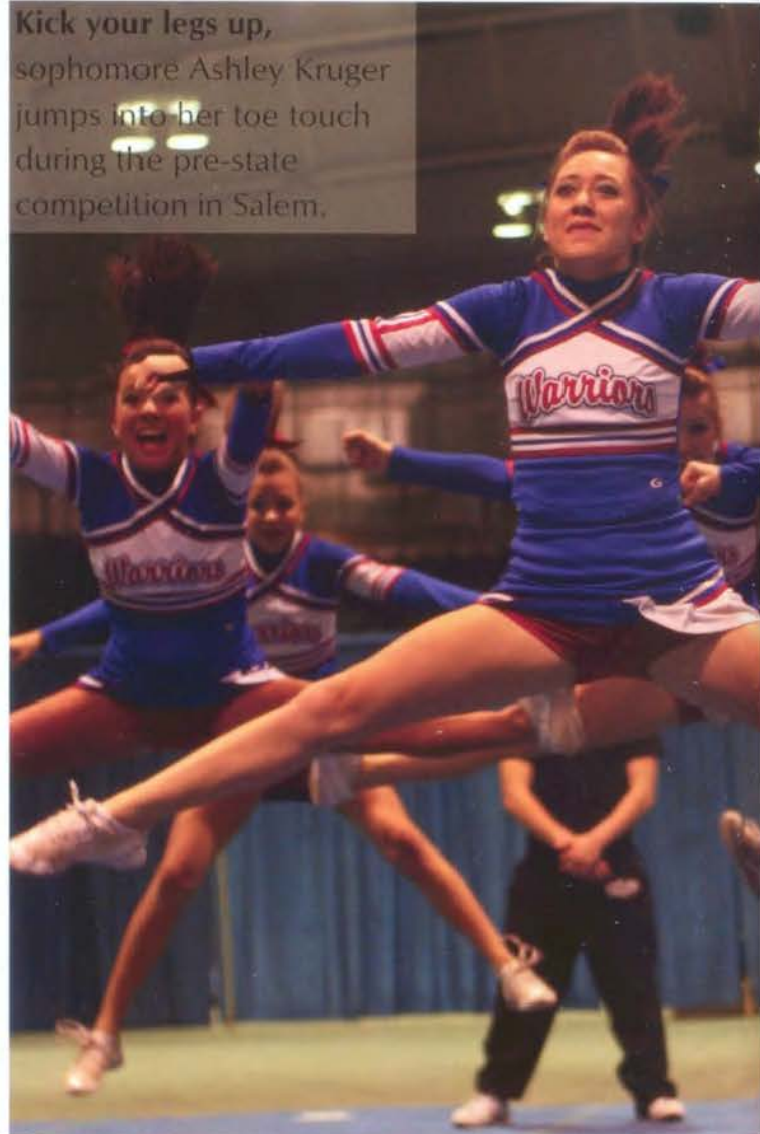

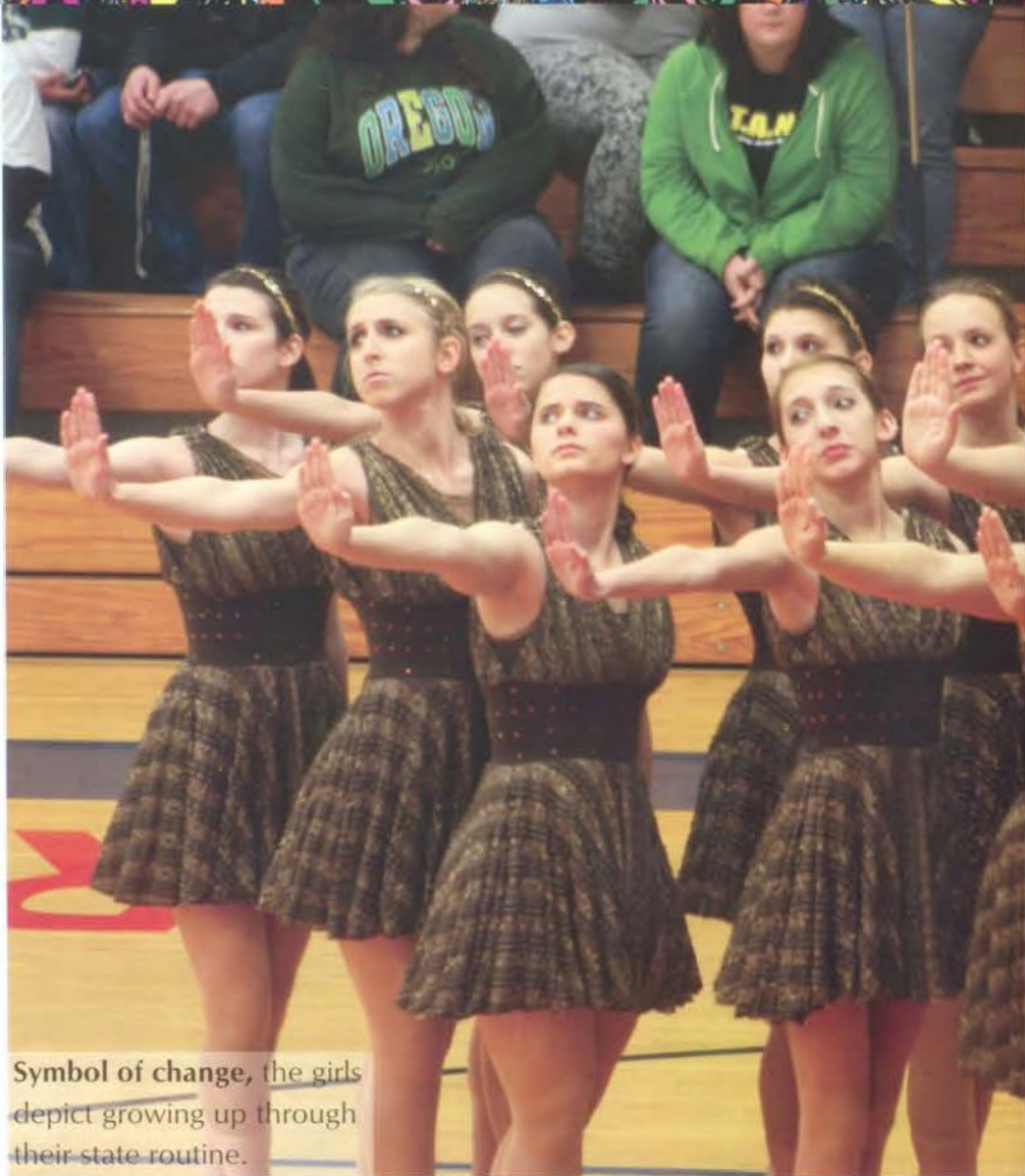

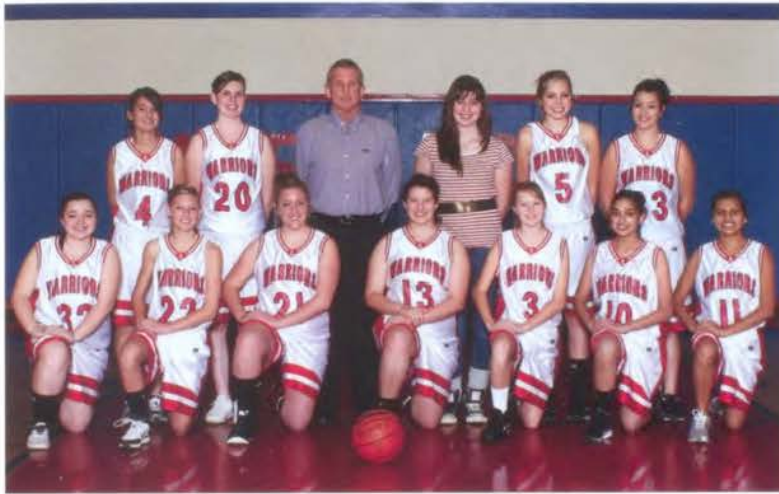

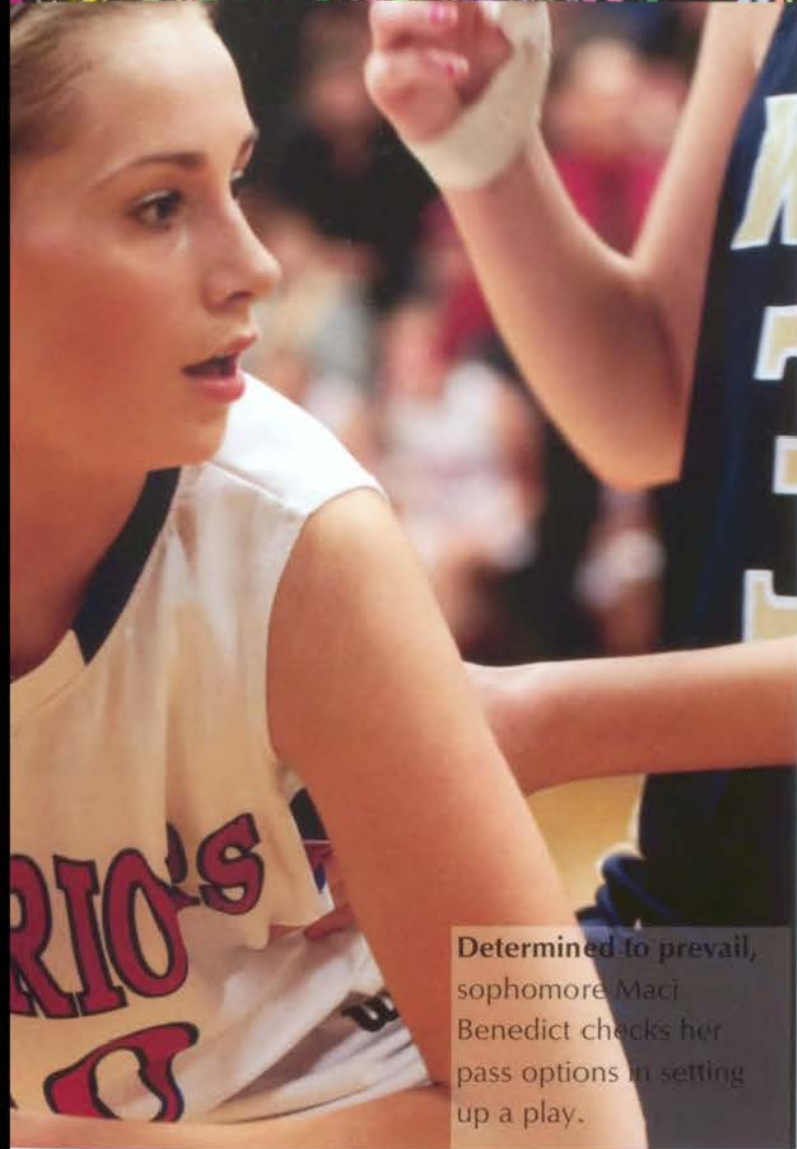



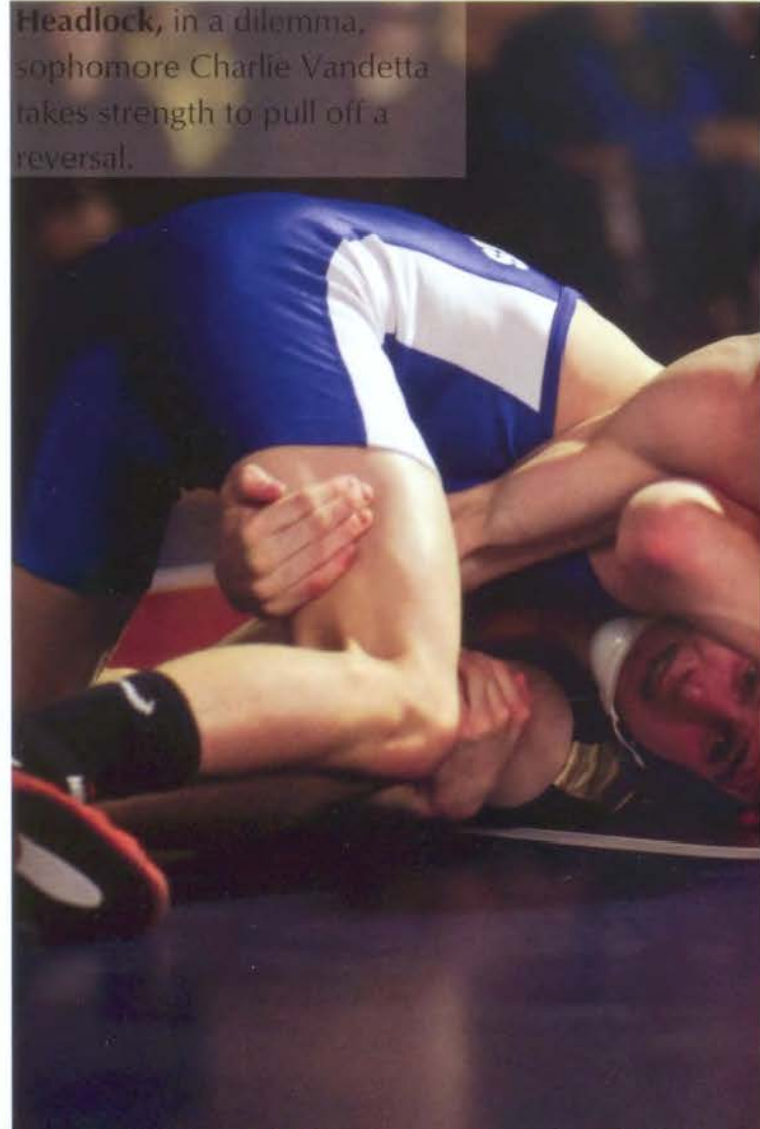

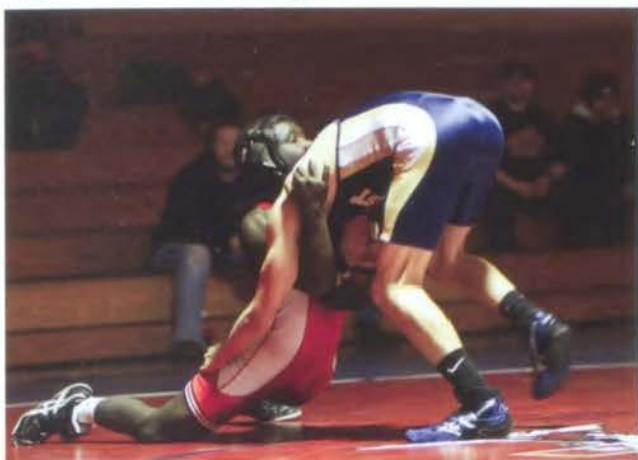

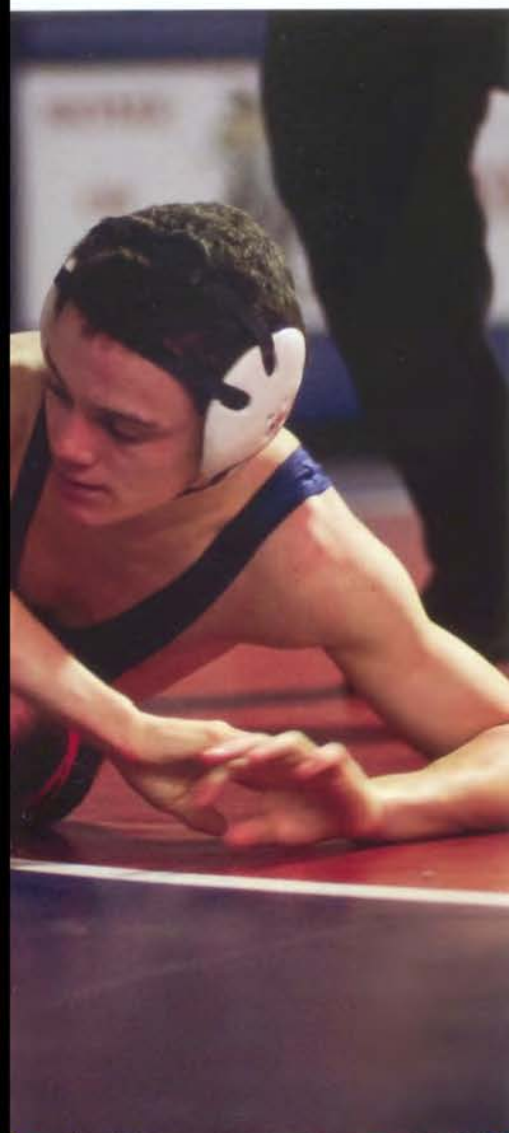

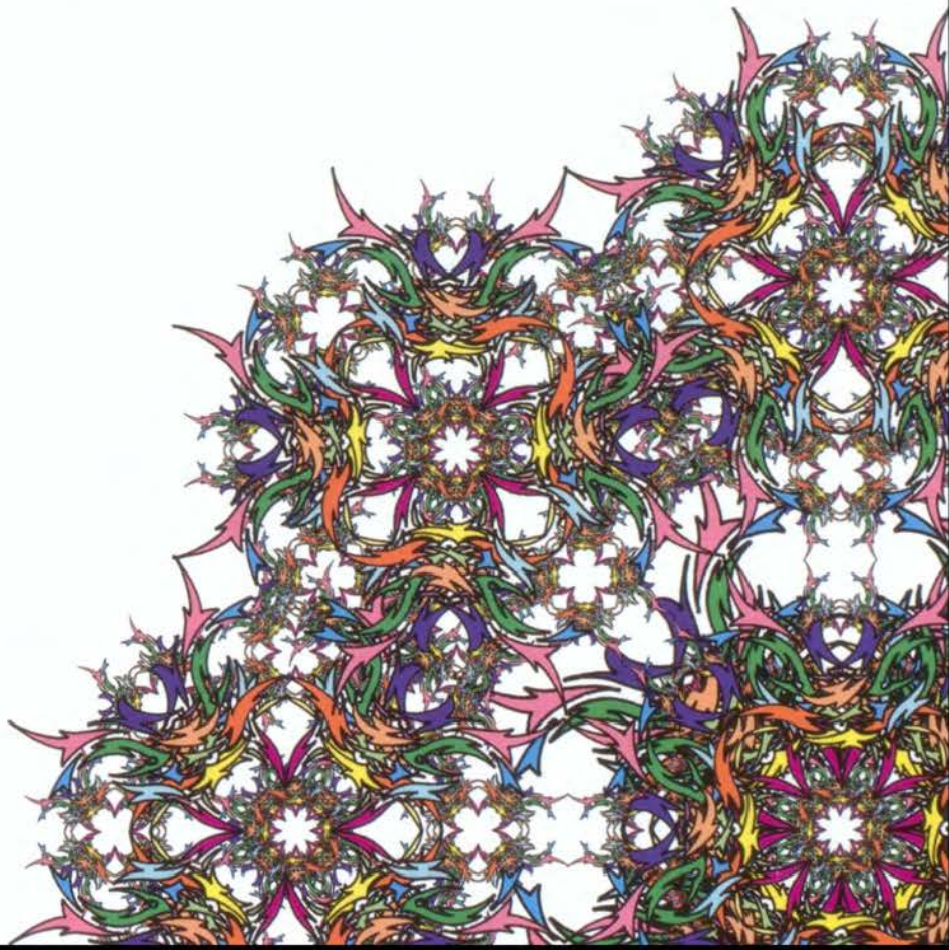

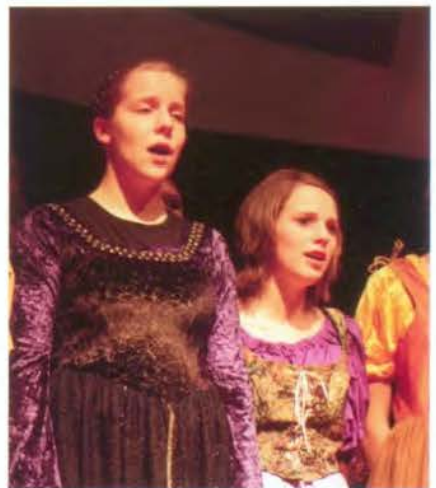

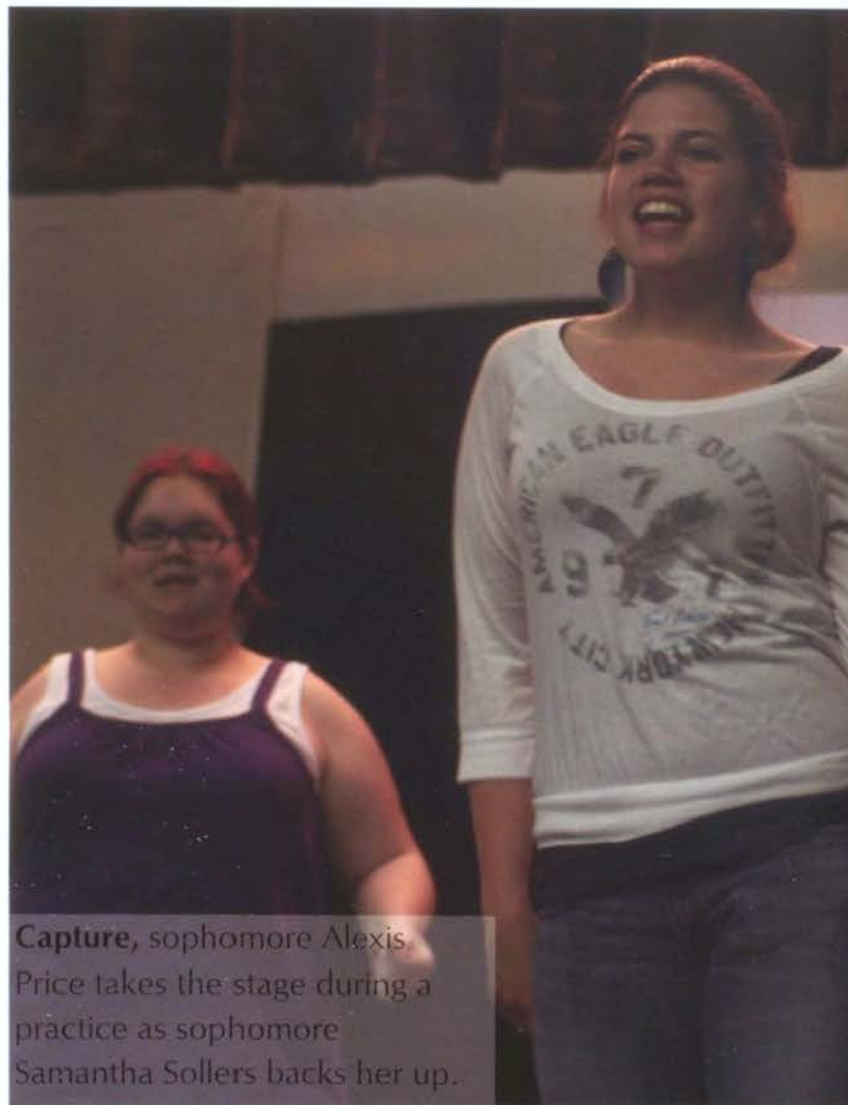

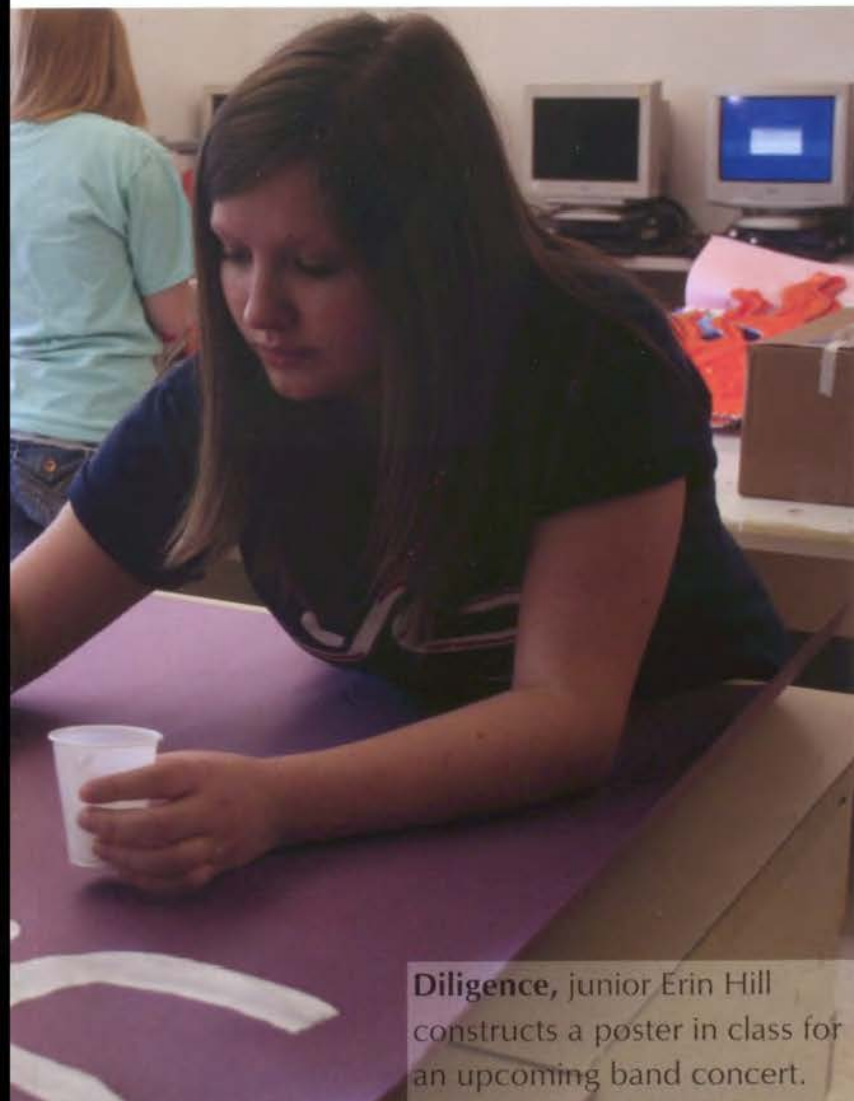

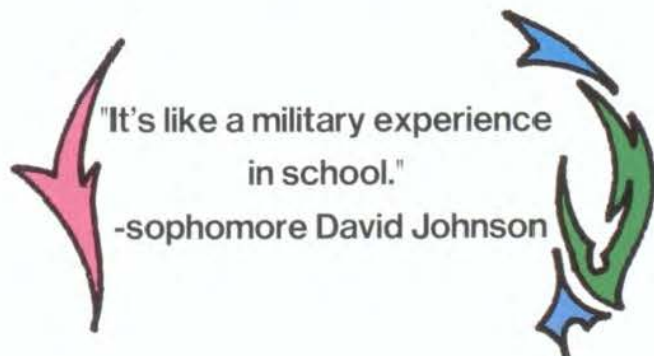
