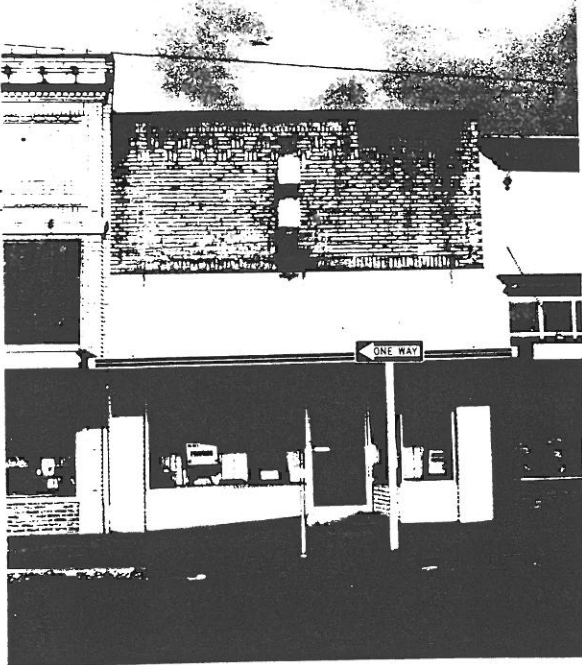

Physical description of property and statement of historical significance:

The Kellenburger & Mayer Butcher Shop is a one-story masonry building with a rectangular floor plan and flat roof. The street level facade has been remodeled with an aluminum frame glass door, flanked by large single-light windows. The transom, located above a flat metal awning, is boarded over. The brick parapet has decorative work at the top.

History

The business originally located here did tin work and made stoves in their workshop at the rear. Kellenburger and Joel C. Mayer were partners in the next business located here, a meat market which lasted until 1913 when Mayer went into the banking business. The market continued here after being purchased by John Lusher. The stone meat storage lockers at the rear were incorporated in the market building built to the north.
