Physical description of property and statement of historical significance:

This is a one and a half story Colonial Revival home with a steeply pitched cross gable and a square floor plan. The walls are clad with shiplap siding and corner boards with abbreviated capitals. There is a frieze below the boxed cornices. The gable ends have returns and shingles laid in alternate rows with staggered butts. There is a corbeled center chimney.

The hip roof front porch has a new concrete foundation and three square posts. On the right there is a three light door and on the left paired windows. There are three windows side by side in the center gable. The south facade contains a window on each side of the ground floor, paired windows in the center between floors and paired windows in the upper right corner. The windows are all one/one, double-hung sash with cornice frames. There is a one-story, hip roof addition on the rear with a large west facing window. The north facade has a hip roof addition along the first floor. There are three one/one double-hung windows grouped together in the north gable end, below the frieze and shingling.

History

The Hall family moved here in 1912 and remained for many years but were not the original owners.
